

MEETING MINUTES
PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING
SEPTEMBER 19, 2016
GERMANTOWN VILLAGE HALL BOARD ROOM

CALL: The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Chairman Hughes.

ROLL CALL: Chairman Hughes, Trustees Baum, Campbell and Myers.

Also present were Police Chief Hoell, Fire Chief Weiss, and Deputy Chief Delain.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Trustee Zabel advised he was speaking on behalf of a resident who had expressed a concern with parking on Main Street. The resident indicated that there are seven parking stalls in front of Gehl's that have orange barrels/cones in the parking area, and have been there for the past week with no apparent purpose. Zabel added that the cones do not have the Village insignia on them and it is unknown who placed them there. Hoell stated he would have an officer check into the matter and would advise Zabel of the results.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: a motion was made by Baum, seconded by Myers, to approve the minutes of the August 1, 2016 Public Safety Committee Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

POLICE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Hoell reported on the following:

- NAC Night was a success and well attended by about 1000 people
- Speedway was experiencing multiple retail thefts, suspect's picture was posted on Facebook and he was identified and charged
- Former K-9 officer Bosco passed away on August 21st
- August 22nd Robert's Custard held a fundraiser for the Germantown Police Department Honor Guard and raised \$3221.00
- Packer cards are available at the police department
- Moving Wall was a successful event and well attended
- There were 2 daytime burglaries on September 7th and a meeting is being held tomorrow night for residents who are being targeted in these burglaries
- Overdoses on heroin/opiates continue to be a problem
- Report of a suspicious vehicle resulted in the arrest of 2 subjects involved in entering vehicles

FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Weiss reported on the following:

- Calls for service have increased, they have responded to 112 more calls than this time last year
- The department has 2598 customer service contacts
- 95 have been trained in CPR
- They responded to 3 calls involving stroke patients, 2 were given TPA within the timeframe for an effective treatment
- There were 2 cardiac arrest incidents
- Moving Wall was an impressive event, the department displayed the US flag between two ladder trucks in honor of the veterans
- They responded to 3 significant fires for the month, 2 involving vehicles and 1 involving a structure

- Baum mentioned a response to a neighbor's residence where it appeared the fire department vehicles responding to the call missed the driveway and had to back up, Weiss stated there was outdated information regarding contact info which has since been updated
- The department's Fire Safety Fair will be held on Saturday, October 1, 2017 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Fire Station 2.

OVERTIME REPORTS: Police Department – Hoell advised the department overtime has slowed down now that the staffing vacancies have been filled.

Fire Department – Weiss reported that the department is doing well with their overtime budget and the numbers are lower than the past 2 years. Delain explained overtime earned by the inspection department and said it was approved in their contract and worked into their wages.

POLICY UPDATES: Police Department – none. Fire Department – none.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: none.

NE BUSINESS: none.
