POLICE DEPARTMENT PURCHASE REQUEST FOR 2ND K9 UNIT: Hoell advised this purchase request was postponed from earlier in the year due to additional funds needed, which are all obtained through donations. He stated the department was requesting to purchase a second K9 Unit which would be assigned to third shift. Hoell explained the benefits of having a 2nd K9 Unit and said that if approved, the department would be placed on a waiting list for the new squad and equipment which would first come in this fall. He added it would be spring before the dog would be purchased and training done for this position. Hoell noted that he would not be with the department next spring but Captain Snow is in full agreement with this project.

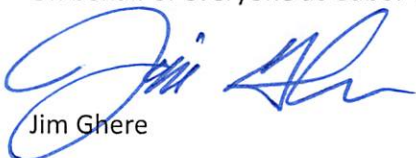
I am writing to request a signage change at the intersection of Mequon Rd. and Pilgrim Rd. Specifically, I would like to request the existing yield sign at the right turn lane from westbound Mequon Rd. to northbound Pilgrim Rd. be changed to a stop sign. Please see the attached diagram.

I am an employee of Gabor Design Build at W156N11238 Pilgrim Rd., the driveway of which is immediately after the right turn lane in question. The existing building at the northeast corner of the intersection (Home Health Managers N112W15568 Mequon Rd.) is near the roadway and significantly interferes with sight. When the westbound light is green, traffic making the right turn in question only slows as much as needed to negotiate the turn and many times accelerates quickly after making the turn; also considering that the right turn is on a slight downhill grade. Additionally, the motorist is typically watching toward the intersection when negotiating the turn and does not look toward the north until later in the turn.

It is difficult to exit our parking lot at Gabor Design Build, especially with the traffic negotiating this right turn in question. We are unable to anticipate the turning traffic because of the blind corner created by the existing building at the northeast corner of the intersection. Many times, when exiting our parking lot, a motorist will turn onto Pilgrim Rd. and we will need to accelerate quickly to avoid a collision.

Please consider changing the existing yield sign to a stop sign. This will provide motorists exiting our parking lot with slightly more time to anticipate and adjust to vehicles making the right turn in question. I am eager to answer any questions you may have. 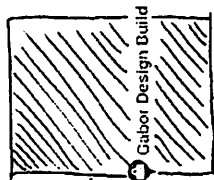

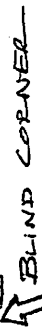
