

MEETING MINUTES
PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING
OCTOBER 4, 2021
GERMANTOWN VILLAGE HALL BOARD ROOM

CALL: The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Chairman Myers.

ROLL CALL: Chairman Myers, Trustees Hudson, J. Miller and Pieper.

Also present were Police Chief Snow, Fire Chief Delain, Clerk Braunschweig.

PUBLIC COMMENT: no comments

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: a motion was made by Hudson, seconded by Pieper, to approve the minutes of the September 20, 2021, Public Safety Committee meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

POLICE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Snow reported on the following:

- He has additional information on the Flock cameras which will be addressed under New Business
- Lt. Schreihart's last day of work was October 1st, he retired after 28 years of service
- The Calls for Service monthly total appeared to be down for the last month, he will be checking those number for accuracy

FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Delain reported on the following:

- Also reports a decrease in numbers for Calls for Service, will be checking further for accuracy
- NFPA compliance numbers continue to be an issue due to stacked calls
- Specifications for new ambulance are being prepared, will possibly get the ambulance by the end of the year
- Public Works completed work on a deck rebuild at the Survive Alive House

NEW BUSINESS:

CLASS A LIQUOR AND FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGE LICENSE, AJIMA CORPORATION, RAJAN SHRESTHA, D/B/A HOLY HILL ROAD, RICHFIELD:

COOLER, STORE FLOOR, OFFICE AND BACK STORAGE: a motion was made by Pieper, seconded by Miller, to forward this item to Village Board with a recommendation of approval for Class A Liquor and Fermented Malt Beverage License, AJIMA Corporation., Rajan Shrestha, N74 W13737 Appleton Ave, Menomonee Falls, d/b/a Holy Hill Road, Richfield; Cooler, Store Floor, Office and Back Storage; for the business located at N128 W21760 Holy Hill Road. Motion carried unanimously.

PET FANCIER LICENSE, CHERIE CARTY, W154 N10230 REGENCY COURT SOUTH, TO KEEP MORE THAN THREE DOGS: a motion was made by Pieper, seconded by Hudson, to approve the Animal Fancier License for Cherie Carty, W154 N10230 Regency Court So. Discussion followed with the following items noted:

- Pieper stated there was a letter received from a neighbor of the applicant who did not support the Animal Fancier License.
- Pieper asked if any complaints had been received at the police department, Snow advised they had no record of any animal complaints for this applicant.
- Myers asked for clarification on number of animals allowed, Braunschweig advised that village ordinance allows for up to 3 dogs or 3 cats or a combination thereof; more than 3 requires an Animal Fancier License
- Hudson felt that the number(s) allowed could pose an issue, Braunschweig responded that the committee could put conditions on the license if they choose to
- Hudson advised he would prefer to see the applicant present at the meeting so they could answer questions for the committee
- Miller asked if the applicant had held an Animal Fancier License in the past, Braunschweig responded they had

Motion to approve carried 3-1 with Miller voting nay.

TINY T'S TEMPORARY OUTSIDE PREMISE EXTENSION, OCTOBER 9, 10AM – 10PM, W157 N11638 FOND DU LAC AVE. FOR THE PURPOSE OF BIRTHDAY PARTY; TENT IN BACKYARD W/TABLES, CHAIRS: a motion was made by Pieper, seconded by Miller, to forward this item to Village Board with a recommendation of approval for Temporary Outside Premise Extension on October 9 from 10AM – 10PM to Tiny T's at W157 N11638 Fond du Lac Ave. for birthday party with tent, tables and chairs. Motion carried unanimously.

FLOCK CAMERAS LEASE AT \$2500 PER CAMERA \$5000 FROM DONATIONS: a motion was made by Pieper, seconded by Miller, to approve the lease of 3 FLOCK cameras at a price of \$2500 each with \$5000 coming from donations. Discussion followed with Snow advising that he would like to obtain 4 cameras as Walmart had just donated \$5000 and Keller had donated \$2500, plus the investigative account had funds for one more. Snow went on to say that 4 cameras would be ideal for the location they are currently set up in, and the crime prevention officer will be approaching other area businesses to see if any others are interested in funding additional cameras.

Pieper advised she would withdraw her original motion and make a new motion to approve this item with an increase from 3 to 4 cameras and that an effort would be made to solicit

funding from other area businesses for additional cameras, and if that fails the funding would be obtained from another source. Motion was seconded by Miller and carried unanimously.

NEXT MEETING: Myers advised that next month's meeting would be held on November 1, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. in the Village Hall Boardroom.

ADJOURNMENT: there being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:21 p.m.
