MEETING MINUTES
PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING
NOVEMBER 1, 2021
GERMANTOWN VILLAGE HALL BOARD ROOM

CALL: The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Chairman Myers.

ROLL CALL: Chairman Myers, Trustees Hudson, J. Miller and Pieper.

Also present were Police Chief Snow, Fire Chief Delain, Clerk Braunschweig.

PUBLIC COMMENT: no comments

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: a motion was made by Pieper, seconded by Hudson, to approve the minutes of the October 4, 2021, Public Safety Committee meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

POLICE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Snow reported on the following:

- Thank you letter to the department from Agent Kenneth Canon with the Department of Corrections, he was Probation/Parole Officer for the area and had accepted a promotion to another position
- Robbery at Speedway which is currently under investigation
- Flock Cameras and resulting incidents/arrests
- \$40,000 grant received from the Department of Justice for Law Enforcement Drug Trafficking Response, grant application was completed by Lt. Mikulec and Officer Whealon, the department is working on implementing a drone program, getting more Flock Cameras, and purchasing another Morpho Touch Unit with these funds

FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Delain reported on the following:

- NFPA compliance numbers continue to be an issue due to stacked calls, the number of multiple calls coming in concurrently are becoming more frequent
- The department has responded to a number of calls involving stroke patients recently and their timely response and treatment has aided in patient recoveries
- Miller congratulated the department on their contribution to successful patient care and thanked them for their participation in the Trick or Treat event on Halloween

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: none

NEW BUSINESS:

WEATHER SIREN UPDATE – CARTER HAEN:

Snow advised this item was placed on the agenda for discussion due to concerns that were brought up earlier in the year when the department was advised by the current siren maintenance company that the siren system utilized by the Village was in need of replacement due to age. Captain Grenier did some research on siren systems and made contact with Sheboygan Warning Systems for another opinion.

Carter Haen of Sheboygan Warning Systems LLC and his partner, Tom Diener, were present to give a brief overview of the type of coverage their business would provide for the Village Siren System. They passed out a service call summary and advised they felt the siren system was not due for replacement, and that it would remain serviceable for some time yet with adequate maintenance and repairs/parts replaced as necessary.

Mr. Haen and Mr. Diener gave committee members time for questions and were able to fill them in on the intricate details of their services and expectations for the sirens located in the Village.

Myers requested that this item be placed on the agenda for next month's meeting under Unfinished Business after additional information has been received from Sheboygan Warning Systems LLC after they have completed their inventory of the village siren system.

K9 SQUAD CAR PURCHASE: Snow advised the department was requesting to purchase a new squad car to replace the 2016 Ford Explorer with 114,000 which is currently in use by the K9 Unit. He advised the funds for this purchase would be taken from the K9 account, and purchase price through Ewald Ford would be \$35,927.00.

A motion was made by Hudson, seconded by Pieper, to forward this item to Village Board with a recommendation of approval for the purchase of a 2022 Ford Explorer for \$35,927.00 from Ewald Ford using funds from the K9 account. Motion carried unanimously.

FLOCK CAMERA LEASE: Snow advised the department had received approval for the lease of 4 Flock cameras, but with the recent grant provided to the department through the Department of Justice, part of those funds could be used to lease the remaining two cameras that were already installed during the demonstration period. He advised there is money in the current budget to cover the cost which is \$5000 until grant reimbursement is received. Snow added that the department would also be looking for approval to lease four additional cameras at a later date and he would come back with that information when it is available.

A motion was made by Pieper, seconded by Miller, to approve the request for the lease of two additional Flock cameras at a cost of \$5000.00. Motion carried unanimously.

PROMOTIONAL PROCESS – REPLACEMENT OF VACANT LIEUTENANT POSITION: Snow advised that the department is short staffed in the supervisory

department with one Lieutenant on light duty and another recent retirement. He requested approval to begin the promotional process to replace the lieutenant position left vacant after Lt. Schreihart's retirement. He added that funds for this position are available in the salaries account, 10-521-510-1110.

A motion was made by Miller, seconded by Pieper, to open the lieutenant's position for a new lieutenant. Myers asked if the promotion would occur from within the department, Snow advised it would. Motion carried unanimously.

ST. BONIFACE CONGREGATION, W204 N11968 GOLDENDALE ROAD, TEMPORARY CLASS B FERMENTED MALT BEER LICENSE ON MARCH 4, MARCH 11, AND MARCH 18, AND TEMPORARY CLASS B FERMENTED MALT BEER AND WINE LICENSES ON JANUARY 15 AND FEBRUARY 18: a motion was made by Pieper, seconded by Miller, to forward these license requests to Village Board with a recommendation of approval for Temporary Class B Fermented Malt Beer License on March 4th, 11th and 18th, and Temporary Class B Fermented Malt Beer and Wine Licenses on January 15 and February 18, in 2022. Motion carried unanimously.

NEXT MEETING: Myers advised that next month's meeting would be held on December 6, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. in the Village Hall Boardroom.

SUBJECT: SERGEANT POSITION

CC:

Prior to 1997 the Germantown Police Department did not require 24/7 mandatory supervision. There were minimum staffing levels, but shifts could work without a supervisor.

In 1997, Chief Ray van Male, implemented a standard that required 24-hour supervision. This requirement was in response to a changing demographic within the department and an accelerated growth within the community, placing increased demands on the police department. This policy is consistent with agencies in southeastern Wisconsin.

The police department used 6 sergeants to provide the 24-hour coverage. At that time the Chief and Captain did not count toward the mandatory staffing requirements as their duties made their schedules unpredictable and they were often unavailable to assist with patrol activities.

Eventually the classification for the shift commander was changed from Sergeant to Lieutenant. They performed the same tasks as the Sergeants and were given additional administrative tasks. They continued to provide the 24-hour coverage with six positions.

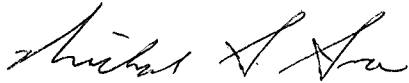
The staffing of supervisors has been a constant challenge since the mandatory staffing standard was imposed. The necessity of always having a supervisor on duty, has not changed. Our agency is getting younger, and it is not uncommon to have a shift where all officers are on probation. Asking a probationary officer to make certain, high liability, decisions required of this profession is not fair given their lack of training and experience. Today it is not uncommon for the Captain or Chief to work road assignments. We simply need an improved structure to ensure efficiency and more realistic expectations for supervisors.

It is for these reasons I am requesting we reinstate patrol sergeants. I understand this will take time. Our goal would be to replace three Lieutenant spots and one Det. Sergeant position, with three sergeant positions, through attrition. We would then need to create three additional sergeant positions. This

ensures the remaining lieutenants can concentrate on administrative tasks and sergeants would be available to supervise the patrol division.

I would like to begin this process by replacing the lieutenant position, recently vacated by the retirement of Lt. Tom Schreihart, with a sergeant position.

JOB TITLE Sergeant Assigned As Shift Commander

ORGANIZATIONAL UNIT Patrol

ORGANIZATIONAL RELATIONSHIP Reports to the Captain of Police.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Shift Commander of each shift is assigned by the Chief of Police and is designated primarily for the rank of sergeant. The Shift Commander is under the command of the Operations Division Commander and is charged with the overall leadership, supervision and administration of subordinate personnel and total performance of the duties and activities of his assigned shift period.

As liaison to management-level administrators, the Shift Commander must keep them informed of conditions, needs, functional developments and all other pertinent information vital to the objectives and goals of the division and department. The Shift Commander is to ensure that rules and regulations, department general orders, directives and standard operating procedures are carried out by subordinates. The Shift Commander is to conduct thorough and accurate performance/training evaluations of subordinates and shall make recommendations for individual training or instruction for individuals identified as having training deficiencies. He/she shall control the planning and directing of work assignments to obtain maximum efficiency and effectiveness from available personnel and coordinate the review and dissemination of information gathered by subordinates which affects other sections of the department. The Shift Commander also has the responsibility of approving or denying overtime and may initiate commendatory or corrective action involving subordinate employees. The Shift Commander may relieve from duty status any subordinate found in a condition detrimental to the department, or in a condition which impairs that person's ability to perform his/her duties.

The Shift Commander must maintain an in-depth knowledge of federal statutes, state statutes, village ordinances, court cases related to work performed, and department labor agreements.

The Shift Commander may also be called upon to supervise various shifts as assigned and be subject to duty call-out. The Shift Commander is required to carry firearms and may use assigned firearms and other weapons in performance of his/her police enforcement responsibilities. Also, the police enforcement responsibilities may include physical labor and endurance and be hazardous with regard to the physical and mental well-being of the incumbent.

SPECIFIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Appendix D-2

1. Supervises, evaluates, trains and counsels subordinates in the performance of their duties. Coordinates and directs subordinate activities to accomplish the mission, goals and objectives of the department.
2. Inspects and documents observations made of personnel and their equipment. Ensures the standards of the department are adhered to and equipment is properly maintained.
3. Plans, organizes, staffs, directs, coordinates and critiques details, emergency assignments and preventive procedures. Maintains composure and professional decorum during stressful and dangerous situations. Assesses situations, makes decisions and directs the performance of subordinates to contain and alleviate a problem. Responds to situations as a supervisor to resolve hostile situations, often under exceptionally hazardous conditions.
4. Develops and maintains lines of communications with superiors and subordinates to ensure an awareness of activities and events affecting the operation. Coordinates work schedules of subordinates to ensure effective and efficient operations.
5. Operates police radios, listens and responds to radio communications for assistance. Observes and identifies suspects, vehicles/license plates and other objects from varied distances in performance of police responsibilities.
6. Performs police enforcement responsibilities to include participating and/or making arrests or related assignments. Operates departmental pursuit vehicles at a high rate of speed in accordance with department policies and under varying, stressful conditions to apprehend violators and respond to emergency situations.
7. Prepares necessary enforcement reports and documentation for court cases. Appears and testifies in official proceedings.
8. Shall be familiar with village ordinances, state statutes and federal statutes, and take appropriate police action when violations are observed.
9. Provides counseling and recommendations for academic pursuits to upgrade individual performance.
10. Plan, organize and direct personnel activities to facilitate department operations.
11. Accept full responsibility for the operational efficiency and

effectiveness of personnel performing assignments during the assigned shift.

12. Make periodic inspections of police equipment, vehicles and facilities to ensure proper care and maintenance.
13. Check arrests and supervise the custody and treatment accorded prisoners and their property, and ensure that proper reports and records are prepared.
14. Ensure that reports of unusual or major occurrences are submitted to the Operations Division Commander in an accurate and timely fashion.
15. Conduct investigations of accidents and injuries to subordinate personnel and submit required reports to the Division Commander.
16. Attend staff meetings as required by the Division Commander.
17. Supervise the activities of personnel assigned to communications and clerical during times when the Communications Supervisor or Lieutenant of Police is not on duty.
18. Review department reports and documents when Lieutenant of Police is not scheduled or urgency requires immediate action. This review will ensure all incidents are properly documented. The document review will be indicated by entering supervisor's signature in review block of document or supervisor's initials on any document not having signature block.
19. Visit each patrol area and contact the assigned area officer as often as practical, ascertaining whether the assigned officer is in his/her area and performing assigned duties. This includes personnel assigned to special details, such as athletic events or public gatherings.
20. Periodically rides with officers to observe performance and to ensure that orders and other instructions are performed.
21. Prepare performance evaluation reports on subordinates assigned to the shift commander.
22. Respond to, and assume command of, any major crime or emergency until relieved by higher ranking officer. Provide notice of the incident to the Operations Division Commander.
23. Supervise the activities of personnel assigned to communications and clerical during the times when

communications supervisor or Lieutenant of Police are not on duty.

24. Performs other duties as assigned or required.

DESIRABLE SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES

The Shift Commander must have a background of demonstrated police knowledge and supervisory ability. The Shift Commander must be proficient in interpersonal skills to motivate subordinates and interact with the public, his/her peers and superiors. The Shift Commander must be familiar with the various collective bargaining agreements that affect his/her subordinates. To successfully manage his/her duties and develop and direct his/her subordinates, the Shift Commander must have strengths in verbal and written communications, and planning and organizing skills. This position requires the rank of departmental sergeant and certification by Wisconsin Training and Standards Bureau. The position also requires possession of a valid Wisconsin driver's license in the appropriate classification required by law.

The Shift Commander should have considerable knowledge of the rules, regulations, policies, procedures, and directives of the department and applicable federal statutes, state statutes and village ordinances. The position also requires considerable knowledge of the streets and physical layout of the community and locations requiring special police attention.

The Shift Commander requires the ability to qualify with department firearms as required by policy. The position also requires the ability to conform with defensive tactics standards as required by policy. The shift commander must have the ability to operate and maintain police vehicles and equipment.

The shift commander position requires a clear speaking voice, the ability to receive, understand and act upon aural instructions through the use of radio, and must be able to visually identify or describe persons, vehicles, locations or other objects at a reasonable distance from a moving motor vehicle. The position also requires the ability to effectively and accurately document enforcement activities in handwritten reports.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION:

The Police Department is requesting authorization to purchase two 2022 Ford Police Interceptor Utility vehicles. The two new squads will replace the following marked squads:

Squad 21 – 102,100+ miles currently (estimated 112,000+ by changeover)

Squad 15 – 87,700+ miles currently (estimated 107,000+ by changeover)

The money for the two new squad cars is in the 2022 budget under account 10-521-570-8100. The department has sent out 5 bid requests: Ewald Ford, Kayser Ford, Boucher Ford, Heiser Ford and Soerens Ford.

I have received bids back from Ewald Ford and Kayser Ford. Kayser Ford had a quote of \$35,423.00 per car, for a total of \$70,846.00 for two 2022 Ford Police Interceptor Utility vehicles.
