January 18, 2023**

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 5:38 p.m. by Chair Pro-Tem. Depies.

ROLL CALL: Commissioners Stapelman, Ewert and Knop. Absent and excused was Trustee Rep. Hudson. Guests included Jan Miller, Village resident and Trustee, John Hill, Kompan, Megan Lee Cunningham, Lee Recreation and via WebEx Harlan Lehman & Russell Williams from Minnesota/Wisconsin Playground. Also present were Director Standridge, Program Supervisor Rodger and Administrative Assistant Lemke.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: *Motion by Stapelman, seconded by Ewert to approve the minutes from November 16, 2022, as presented. Motion unanimously carried.*

CORRESPONDENCE: None

OLD BUSINESS:

Depies stated that Kinderberg Park is the “high-lighted” park of Germantown.

Kinderberg Feasibility Study, Playground – Update & Presentations:
John Hill, Kompan, gave a brief history of how and where Kompan started. He presented the Commission with 3 different play equipment options for Kinderberg Park.

- 1st playground option for ages 5-12, holds approximately 68 kids with 21 play activities.
 - 1 Cone twister net to climb on.
 - Set of 2 Bloqx (pentagon shaped balls) to climb on.
 - 5 different swings in one unit.
 - 1 Tipi carousel w/ top brace.
 - 1 Cliff rider w/ slide (main climbing component)
- 2nd playground option for ages 5-12, holds approximately 98 kids with 9 play activities.
 - 1 Garden seesaw
 - Set of 3 Bloqx (pentagon shaped balls) to climb on.
 - 5 different swings in one unit.
 - 1 Stella Nova for standing on and rotating by pushing/pulling.
 - 1 Performer Dome (main climbing component, no slide)
- 3rd playground option for ages 5-12, holds approximately 85 kids with 19 play activities.
 - 1 Garden seesaw
 - 5 different swings in one unit.
 - Stella Nova for standing on and rotating by pushing/pulling.

- Set of 6 Bloqx (pentagon shaped balls) to climb on.
- 1 Rainier (main climbing component) w/slide.

Depies questioned why there is open space in the middle of the site plan? John indicated that was if you wanted to add additional equipment in the future.

Stapelman asked what play equipment is there to accommodate pushing a person in a wheelchair on? John stated there is a universal carousel that is flush with the surface.

Jan Miller stated that she likes the tubular slide that can be built into a hill. With the natural hill is there a possibility for that type of slide? John stated absolutely.

Megan Lee Cunningham, Lee Recreation presented their 3 designs for the play equipment.

Harlan Lehman, Minnesota/Wisconsin Playground gave their proposal as follows:

- This is an inclusive playground no matter what your abilities are.
- Each playground piece is accessible via wheelchair or walking.
- 3 different slides and ramps.
- Slides are wheelchair height with transfer platforms.
- Slides are steeper.
- Rock n raft, accommodates up to 4 full size wheelchairs and able body children.

Depies asked Gil to make these presentations available to residents via the Village website and/social media.

NEW BUSINESS:

Summer Kids Klub 2023 Fees: Supervisor Rodger discussed the fee increase proposal presented. The fee increase would be \$6.00 a day. This would allow everyday to be the same fee no matter field trip day or non-field trip. The bussing, entrance fees for trips and staffing fees have increased therefore we need to increase fees. Rodger stated that she has contacted other bussing companies, however the companies are either short staffed or are now owned by Riteway.

Motion by Ewert, seconded by Stapelman to accept to proposed fee increase for 2023 Summer Kids Klub. Motion unanimously carried.

Special Trail Study Meeting w/ Park & Recreation Commission – Wednesday, January 25, 2023 @ 7:00p.m. at Firemen's Park Indoor Shelter: Gil stated that he developed a non-voting volunteer, 8 citizen committee that have an interest in existing trails as well as future trails. Commissioner Stapelman was added to the trail committee based on interest. Gil stated that he had sent out RFP's to 8 different consulting firms, to develop a Masterplan for a trail system in Germantown. Of those

8, 2 consulting firms submitted their proposal. The trails committee would meet to discuss at 6:00 p.m. with the Park & Recreation Commission meeting at 7:00 p.m. to make a recommendation to the Village Board.

VILLAGE BOARD REPORT: Excused

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT: Russ stated that the IGA was tabled until there is a full board for further discussion.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Performance Evaluations

During November and December I conducted employee evaluations for my full time staff. For each staff member I selected four areas of core competency that I felt was most pertinent to their job responsibilities. Employees were given the opportunity to give comments and tell me their accomplishments in these areas. I was able to respond to what I have observed for those areas. Then I scored each area from 1 to 5 with 5 being excellent.

Staff was also asked to give two goals in four different areas, Customer, Process, Growth, and Financial, and comment on how they expected to achieve the two goals and I gave Supervisor comments.

All staff scored well and each will receive a 2% merit increase for 2023. Bonuses are yet to be determined based on financial audits being conducted.

Request for Proposal – Trails Master Plan

I have received approval to spend \$30,000 to hire consultants to develop a trails master plan for the Village of Germantown. I sent out eight (8) RFP's, and I received two actual proposals. One from GRAEF Consultants, and the other from Hardwood Engineering. I have invited both teams to present to the trails committee next Wednesday night the 25th, and then a recommendation will be made to the Parks Commission for a vote. I will then take the decision of the Commission to the Board for final approval so hopefully in early February the consultant team can begin work on a plan.

Trails Committee

After much discussion with Brian Depies I formed an unofficial non-voting, volunteer committee,

Of citizens (7) who have interest in developing trails in Germantown. Folks who are somewhat knowledgeable about trails and are avid walkers, joggers, or bicyclists. We held our first meeting before the holidays, and discuss the philosophy of the committee, and that is to assist me into looking into pedestrian and river trail development, recommendations we can make to the Consultants that will be hired to do a master plan of Germantown trails in 2023.

This committee will make recommendations to the Park Commission for vote if and when that is necessary.

Picnic Tables

The Village Board approved \$49,000 to purchase 48 new picnic tables. This will allow us to remove all the remaining wooden picnic tables we have at Haupt Strasse and the old Firemen outdoor picnic shelter and replace with the metal tables we currently have in most of our parks. The wooden tables will be put up for auction and will generate

some revenue from that. I am going to GGF to get approval to use Lee Recreation as our source for the tables. All of the other aluminum tables have been ordered thru Lee Recreation. This will give us consistency throughout the parks. Also I have received quotes from two other outdoor fitters and Lee Recreation by far is the cheapest deal over all.

Port a Johns

I am working with the same local port a john company that has serviced our parks for years. They have requested a \$10 increase per port a john for the year. The port a johns will be cleaned and service each Friday through out the contract. Any issues or vandalism we have had in the past Port A John has sent some one out to take care of the problem in a reasonable time.

RFP Turf Management

I will be developing an Request for Proposal (RFP) to send out to landscape vendors to do the same work that Total Lawn Care has done in the parks and athletic fields the last ten years. Specs will involve treatment five times a year for a complete Turf management program. Treatment will include top dressing, aerivation, herbicide application, fertilization, seeding, and broadleaf herbicide, for nine village parks and the Friedenfeld Football Fields.

Total Lawn Care will submit a proposal.

Recreation Division Report January 18, 2023 Commission Meeting

We have 56 programs starting/ongoing in January and include: Bucketeers, 1st/2nd Grade Buckets, Hoopsters, Mini Poms, Poms, Power/Pixies/Spark Poms, Tae Kwon Do, Yoga, Rise & Shine Boot Camp, Team Training (3 classes), Sporties for Shorties, Kids Choir, Kalahari Trip, Indoor Tennis, Afterschool Volleyball (3 sites), Afterschool Legos (4 sites), Learn to Skate, Into to Hockey, Learn to Speed Skate, Pelvic Floor Workshop, Dog Therapy, Dog Training Classes (Puppy, Essentials I & II), Learn to Make Sausage, STREAM Day Off Classes (2), Home Buying, Home Selling, Essential Oils, Oodles of Art, Babysitters Training, Tot Time, Youth & Little Tykes Martial Arts, Music Fun, Music Fun Families, Music Fun Babies, Old Family Photos & the Digital Age, Irish Dance, Dance It out, and Snowflake Hunt. Ongoing programs are Men's Open Basketball, Pickleball, Monday CoRec Volleyball League, Kids Klub (5 sites). Programs cancelled due to low enrollment: Martin Skills Academy

Upcoming events include the following:

Snowflake Hunt: We have 111 people enrolled. They need to find 30 signs hidden in our parks, each with a letter on them. Once they have all the letters they need to unscramble them to form a phrase. Once they have the phrase they can email us and they will be entered to win a prize basket.

Snowman/Snow Creature Building Contest: We are looking for the best snowman/creature builders in the Village. To enter they simply have to pre-register and submit a photo of their masterpiece with the builder standing by it. Deadline to submit photos is Feb. 20th. We look forward to seeing the creative entries and hope we have enough snow so they can create them!

Special Parks Commission Meeting
January 25, 2023
Minutes

Meeting called to order 7:00 pm

Present were Commissioners Brian Depies, Steve Stapleman, Wendy Knopp, and Phil Hudson.

Excused absence Russell Ewert

First order of business was introductions of all Trail Committee members.

Director Standridge explained this committee was formed as an advisory committee to work with Gil on trail plans for the Village of Germantown. The committee would make recommendations when it came to the Trails plans to the Park Commission who would then decide by vote. Also the Trails committee will meet periodically with the Trails Consultant to make recommendations and have discussions that may assist the consultants in their master plan for a trails plan for Germantown

Brian Depies (acting Chairperson) then let the commission know that the trails committee had voted on their choice for a Trails Consultant. He announced that the committee unanimously voted for the GRAEF consultant team. Brian asked for discussion from the Parks Commission.

Commissioner Knop asked if we had worked with Graef before. Brian and Mark Schroeder both talked about the work GRAEF did for the Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan. Mark pointed out without this plan we would not be able to apply for future grants pertaining to trails.

Parks Director Standridge also talked how he worked with GRAEF in 2022 on the Kinderberg Feasibility Study that GRAEF conducted and wrote up. Conducted open houses and developed a plan for a future playground which the budget was adopted by the Board to fund a new playground in 2023.

This was basically all the discussion the Parks Commission had.

Brian asked for a commission motion. Trustee Hudson made the motion to accept GRAEF as the Trails Consultant to write up a master trails plan for 2023. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Knop. A vote was taken and the Commission voted unanimously to accept GRAEF as the Trails Consultant.

Commissioner Depies (acting Chairperson) called for adjournment at 7:13 pm.

February Parks Commission Meeting

Formation of Trails Committee

The Parks Director put together a group of seven (7) Germantown residents to form a Volunteer Trails Committee. These residents who volunteered to serve all have experience with Germantown Trails and have used them and can offer insights on trail expansion and improvement. The Trails committee votes on issues they deal with within the committee, and can make recommendations to the Parks Commission. But the committee has no voting power within the commission. The committee may have more direct contact with the consultants than the commission but will report all data and information they gather to the commission. The Committee will meet at least once a month, however more often once plans start to come into play.

Also the Trails committee were instrumental in our discussions about the two consultant teams that wrote up proposals for our trails master plan.

The Village Board approved the agreement to use GRAEF Consultants to conduct the Master Trail Plan.

Wisconsin Parks and Recreation Conference

My two recreation supervisors Katie Rodger, and Patti Heinen and myself attend the WPRA conference January 31s-Feb 3rd in the Dells at the Kalahari Resort. I attended a pre-conference workshop on How To Write a Successful grant application. Each of us try to divide up the sessions so we were all gathering valuable information. I also enjoyed the exhibit hall and meeting various vendors. Setting up contacts for future projects as well as talking to vendors who are working with us on current projects. Gathered some valuable information such as what to put in an RFP for a playground.

The socials were fun and allowed the professionals to get to know each other on a different level.

The silent auction brought in considerable amount of money, and hats off to Blackstone Golf Course who gave us a foursome for 18 holes plus cart to put in as an auction item. Probably a \$300 value.

The keynote speakers had excellent stories that tied in to our every day life of trials and tribulations. Next years conference will be held in LaCrosse Wisconsin and I look forward to attending.
