MINUTES

- I. **CALL TO ORDER:** *This meeting has been given public notice in accordance with Section 19.83 and 19.84, Wis. Stats, in such form that will apprise the general public and news media of subject matter that is intended for consideration and action.*

- The meeting was called to order by Chairman Hudson at 7:00pm.

II. **ROLL CALL:**

- Present were Chairman Hudson, Trustee Baum and Trustee Neureuther. Trustee Pieper was absent and excused.
- Also present were Administrator Kreklow, Chief Snow and Chief Delain, and Finance Director Uselding. Attorney Sadjak joined the meeting via WebEx.

- III. **CITIZEN INPUT:** *(Please be advised per 19.84(2) that information and comment will be received from the public. It is the policy of this municipality that public input be limited to a three (3) minute period per person with a time extension granted at the discretion of the Chairperson. Be advised that there may be limited discussion of the information received but no action will be taken under public comments.)*

- Jan Miller of W151N10297 Windsong Cr W addressed the Police Chief and Fire Chief, stating her continued support of Police & Fire and her involvement in helping to get additional staffing. Would like to see the cost vs. benefits, as this Committee has asked for ideas from Administrator Kreklow in paying for Police & Fire from within the budget. The budget discussion on the agenda should be moved to the beginning of this meeting. 2021 audit came back being off \$750,000 - where was the \$300,000+ surplus get applied? The Chiefs would be happy with adding at least some personnel in 2024 to help their existing staff. What about 2 Police and 1 squad car, and 2 Fire Fighters. Committee has asked what the cost would be, do we need a referendum, and I hope you can review the numbers before a decision is made.
- Melanie Smythe of N140W17938 Cedar Ln stated her full support in bringing on additional Public Safety personnel. Public Safety is the #1 responsibility of this group, and wonders why the numbers to fund positions don't get to you

when you've asked numerous times. Do we really need to cut operations by 6%, or cut 10% of roadwork - what are the real numbers.

- Scott Hefle of W159N10514 Old Farm Rd commented that this Committee has been asking for numbers & options, for months, and still have no idea where the information is. The budget gap is actually larger since monies came from the State to the Police & Fire, yet it's wrong to use it to close a budget gap. Give it to Public Safety for additional personnel. What are the options should the referendum not pass? We need real numbers presented to this Committee and the Village Board in order to make a decision.

Chairman Hudson offered a public thank you to Ryker Holms of the GFD for a tour of the Fire Station earlier in the week, along with answering many questions brought forward. He encouraged the other Committee members to visit with Ryker, as it was very informative.

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

1. 08/07/23 Public Safety Committee Meeting Minutes

- **Motion made** by Baum, seconded by Neureuther, to approve the minutes of the 8/7/23 PSC meeting as presented. No discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.

V. REPORTS:

A. Police Monthly Report

- Monthly report comparisons correction: 23 compared to 22, labeled wrong
- Calls for service indicate a slight increase over last year.
- Over the last week, 33 vehicle entries, 2 burglaries, 2 vehicles stolen. Citizens have provided Ring camera footage that indicates appx. 6 young men involved, targeting the SE area of the Village.

B. Fire Department Monthly Report

- Activity numbers are on track with last year.
- Please be aware there is presently a Mequon ambulance in the Village that we will be using while (1) ambo is having warranty repair done in Iowa, and our primary ambulance had an a/c fail. DPW is working to get the parts, but the interim solution is to borrow a Mequon ambulance.
- Chairman Hudson asked if "borrow" meant "free"; Chief Delain confirmed the borrow was free as the new SOFD merger created a vehicle surplus.
- We also had an Engine a/c fail this week, and again DPW is working to repair.

C. Overtime Report

- Police:
 - OT is consistent with YTD, but anticipate being at full staffing by EOY.
 - Chairman Hudson asked for a general estimate of OT for 2023; Chief Snow believes it will come close to the \$200,000 range.
- Fire:
 - With the addition of the new Battalion Chief, we were at full staffing, but we now have a FT employee on maternity leave which will cause some OT.
 - Chairman Hudson asked for a general estimate of OT for 2023; Chief Delain believes it will be appx \$120,000.

VI. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Issues of obscene music, public disturbances, damage at Kinderberg Park.

- Park & Rec Committee voted to remove the basketball hoops for the remainder of 2023; they re-visit this topic in March 2024.
- Park & Rec will be adding 2-4 hot coal bins; as grills ARE allowed in our parks, there was nowhere to dispose of them.
- Chief Snow reported that 120 of 168 calls in the last 3 weeks were for extra patrols of the area; 9 violations of parking, and 6 instances of incorrect usage of driving up to the shelter. There were 5 vandalism complaints resulting in a significant cost of damage, 6 noise complaints, 7 miscellaneous complaints. GPD has been more visible in the parks, and that has helped deter.
- Baum asked what happened to the idea of placing wooden barricades; Hudson reported the Village Board removed from Park & Rec the funding of placing ballads to replace the gates that had been removed. Baum was hopeful an inexpensive solution was 3-4 barricades from DPW to deter driving onto the path. He received a citizen email suggesting numerous possible solutions, all of which would cost something.
- Chief Snow will speak with Highways/DPW to see what they might have to use.

VII. NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Oktoberfest; Germantown Historical Society Inc.; Dheinsville Historic Park 09/23/23 – 09/24/23; Temporary Class "B" Fermented Malt Beverage & Wine Picnic License; James Dix, President
- **Motion made** by Baum, seconded by Neureuther, to approve. No discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.
- B. Denial of Direct Sellers, Transient Merchants & Solicitors License: Adam M Williams
- At the time of application, individual did have an active warrant, as well as a criminal record that would not lend well to issuing a solicitor's license.
 - **Motion made** by Baum, seconded by Neireither, to approve the denial of solicitor's application. No further discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.
- C. Issues of panhandling in the Village, discussion to include comments from Chief of Police.
- Chairman Hudson reported there had been a complaint at a recent meeting that panhandling was on the rise in the Village. As we do not have an ordinance against panhandling, so unless the private land owner makes a complaint there is nothing the Police can do.
 - Chief Snow reported there have been 12 complaints in 2023, which is a significant number already, but it was decided by the US Supreme Court to be a constitutionally protected right under freedom of speech. We cannot create an ordinance to ban panhandling, but some communities have specified it not allowed in certain areas, or it cannot be considered aggressive panhandling. Our Village has ordinances that would cover that area, such as Disorderly Conduct or Trespassing, and as of now they cannot interfere with traffic or business.
 - Attorney Sajdak commented that ordinances that limit the activity in certain locations, it needs to be applied to everybody.
 - Baum asked how large of a problem this has become; Chief Snow said this is not a severe tax on our resources. Most cases they move along if asked.
- D. Squad Replacement
- **Motion made** by Baum, seconded by Neureuther, to approve the purchase of a Squad replacement. No discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.

E. F150 Request to Purchase

- This F150 will replace the evidence van, which was purchased many years ago as a transport van that now sits unused. It will be used by the evidence technicians, as well as be a patrol vehicle in 2024. We are only asking to order the vehicle now, at a savings of \$8,000 for a 2023 model, but will receive and pay for the vehicle in 2024.
- Baum clarified this will be one of the 2024 purchased vehicles, just want to do so early.
- **Motion made** by Baum to forward this to the Village Board with positive recommendation. Neureuther seconded for discussion: is this a Capital purchase for 2024? Hudson asked if this was something we could walk away from if not passed? Chief Snow answered YES to both questions.
- No further discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.

F. GFD Command Vehicle - Purchase Opticom and Command Cabinet Build

- Chief Delain informed the Committee they were looking to purchase a specially-built cabinet for the command vehicle, to replace a home-built cabinet that has damaged expensive radio equipment due to its movement within the vehicle. When this cabinet is installed, there will be access to install Opticom to the vehicle's electronics. Opticom is the safety software that communicates with the newer traffic lights being installed, letting citizens know we are approaching the intersection.
- These funds are not specifically budgeted in 2023, but we do have the money for it to come out of one of our line item budgets for 2023.
- **Motion made** by Baum, seconded by Neureuther, to forward this to the Village Board with a positive recommendation for purchase. There was no further discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.

G. GFD Portable Radio Purchase

- Chief Delain reported this radio and microphone purchase was budgeted for when we put together the quote for the new Tender vehicle. The monies are part of the 2023 budget.
- **Motion made** by Neureuther, seconded by Baum, to approve the purchase as presented. No further discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.

H. GFD Purchase of Hydraulic Extrication Tools

- Chief Delain reported this extrication equipment purchase was budgeted for when we put together the quote for the new Tender vehicle. The monies are part of the 2023 budget.
- **Motion made** by Baum, seconded by Neureuther, to approve the purchase as presented. No further discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.

I. WE Energies Foundation Grant - GFD Usage

- Chief Delain reported WE Energies grant was awarded to GFD to cover 80% of the purchase price of a Quad Gas meter, with a resident couple donating the remainder 20% just today to cover this purchase.

J. A Resolution Adopting Updated Bond Schedule for Municipal Court Cases

- Chief Snow reported this in response to an updated bond schedule; chart details amounts.
- Attorney Sajdak clarified the change details, something we must do to comply with the State imposed fees and updated statutes.

Motion made by Baum, seconded by Neureuther, to approve the resolution updating the bond schedule for municipal court cases as presented. No further discussion, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.

K. Alternative Public Safety Referendum Questions

- Administrator Kreklow commented on the ongoing need of staffing the Police (4 FT) and Fire (12 FT) Departments. Total cost for those (16) positions is appx. \$1.6 million. The only realistic funding option is to go to a referendum, which has been presented here tonight in two formats:
- Option 1: the full \$1.6 million amount, all 16 FT positions, for the 2024 budget
- Option 2: half of the amounts for 2024 budget, half of the amounts for the 2025 budget.
- Administrator Kreklow recommended to move this forward to the Village Board for further action, especially if the Village Board will utilize the Committee's recommendation to use Village staffing to handle the communication and public outreach that will be necessary. If Village resources are not available, I will be leading 3 Town Hall meetings this fall as part of our budget process. Or a Utility bill will be going out soon that could include this information.
- Trustee Baum asked to see documentation regarding what are the positions being requested, what are the numbers involved. And do these additional positions wipe out OT?
 - Finance Director Uselding presented to the shared screens the budget layout numbers for the requested positions.
 - Chief Snow - we're at minimum staffing levels , 3 Officers and 1 Supervisor, so additional 4 Officers would help alleviate OT but not eliminate.
 - Discussion continued with Snow and Kreklow providing more clarity on the topic.
 - Chief Delain - our request will not eliminate OT, be aware when both ambulances are out on calls the Station is empty. We do put out calls to backfill the Station, but rarely do we get enough personnel to do so. Our MABAS agreement cannot be relied upon in these situations (explanation given, examples of Fire code laws and situations). This

- request of (12) personnel will allow us to achieve all our goals for safe fire ground and Station coverage when we're busy.
- Discussion continued regarding staffing option scenarios.
- Trustee Neureuther asked if the numbers would be current enough for a referendum next year? What is the cost impact to a home of specific value?
 - Uselding explained the formula which would increase the Mill rate by \$ 0.55 (per \$1,000) so \$300,000 home would be an increase of \$165.00.
- Baum would like to table this until next meeting to review financing options should the referendum not go through.
- Trustee Hudson commented that the Committee owes it to our Public Servants to stop tabling this issue; we have to support this and move it forward. We are delaying the process by keeping this at the Committee level, and even if the language is not perfect, we need to move this forward to the Village Board.
- **Motion made** by Baum to forward both referendum options to the Committee of the Whole for review in the budget process for determining which staffing level to proceed with (full amount 1 year; half amounts over 2 years). Seconded by Neureuther . Discussion continued regarding specifics of the referendum options.
- Baum amended his motion to include the understanding that this topic will be back at the next Committee meeting to continue discussing other solutions for staffing levels.
- Neureuther noted this should go to the Village Board; Atty Sajdak suggested the Committee of the Whole as it would allow for more discussion.
- Hudson asked for further discussion, asked for a vote, all voted in favor, **motion passed** unanimously.

Administrator Kreklow asked for the Committee to please bring forward for next meeting anything they would like to see in more detail; info from the Finance Director, the Chiefs, the Administrator. He offered meeting availability to the Trustees before the next Public Safety Committee meeting to discuss the information and numbers. Chairman Hudson suggested the other Trustees should visit the GFD to see Ryker Holms presentation and ask questions.

L. 2024 Budget Preview

Finance Director Uselding presented the requested Police and Fire Budgets for 2024. Discussion ensued regarding vehicles (Police squads and Fire ambulance), staffing, ambulance/EMS revenue, healthcare, WRS increased contributions.

VIII. NEXT MEETING:

The next Public Safety Committee meeting was set for Wednesday, 10/04/23 at 6:30pm.

IX. ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION:

At the September Public Safety meeting staff presented two alternative resolutions to hold a referendum adding public safety staffing at levels recommended by the Police Chief and Fire Chief. These alternative resolutions were also discussed at the Committee of the Whole meeting on the 2024 Budget. During these meetings members of the Village Board asked staff to determine the potential for another alternative to increase staffing while eliminating or reducing the amount that would be taken to referendum for approval. After further reviewing the 2024 Recommended Budget and discussing the timing of additional public safety staff with the Police and Fire Chiefs, we have identified an alternative approach that appears to be feasible.

The Board could take the following actions that would provide near term staffing relief for the Police and Fire Departments while working towards achieving the full staffing needs:

1. Add 3 Police Officers and 1 Detective to the 2024 Police Department Budget. Funding two of these positions for the full year and 2 of these positions for six months would cost \$315,000. This additional cost could be offset by:
 - a. \$118,000 additional transportation aids. – We received the final transportation aid number from the State DOT and it was \$118,000 higher than what we included in the Recommended Budget.
 - b. \$151,000 increase in the property tax levy (TID new construction). - All other things being equal, this would increase the property tax bill on a \$300,000 home by about \$30 per year.
 - c. \$46,000 decrease in the tree planting budget (DPW)
2. Place a binding referendum question on the April 2024 ballot to add 6 firefighter/paramedics to the Fire Department budget, increasing the property tax levy by \$601,000. This would increase the estimated tax rate for 2025 from \$5.60 to \$5.81. The property tax bill for a \$300,000 home would increase by about \$65 per year.
3. Utilize the TID new construction increment from 2026 to the closure of TID 7 or 8 to fund one additional firefighter/paramedic per year. Fund additional firefighter/paramedics needed at the time of TID closure from the additional levy available.
