Battalion Chief Holms provided a monthly report and additional information regarding data integration for new reporting since the switch to County Dispatch, 3 new hires completed their Academy, Fourth of July happenings, regional EMS meeting information, June YOY we are up 3%.

GPD: Chief Merten reported Dispatch OT will continue to decline as the consolidation completed on 7/7/25, patrol OT increased due to activity.

GFD: BC Holms reported June OT up due to 3 on FMLA, recent new hires will alleviate this going forward.

Village Administrator Steve Kreklow presented the (7) options that were drafted to be presented to Graef for cost estimates (analysis fee of \$75,200):

1. Review previously presented options to identify cost reduction
 1. New Police Station at old DPW site
 2. Renovation and expansion of existing GFD Station 2
 3. Building of new GFD Station at site of Friedenfeld Park.
2. Investigate use of Ascension building (recently purchased by Village) as a Police Station.
3. Cost estimate of new Police Station at the old DPW site.
4. Expansion and renovation of existing Fire Station 2. (Building age requires updated infrastructure, new windows, etc.)
5. Expansion and renovation of existing Police Station.
6. If Police move to another location, renovate existing Police Station as second Fire Station.
7. Investigate a combined Police & Fire facility. Only Village-owned land available would be Kinderberg Park, which the Administrator would not recommend.

It was requested of the Committee to move viable options ahead to the Village Board so that this project keeps moving forward.

Lengthy Committee discussion ensued, including topics: land-swap, old Kwik-Trip location, square footage comparisons, plan for today versus future, updated list of Village-owned property, Village park location(s) discussion, acreage requirements for combined building, similar projects in neighboring communities.

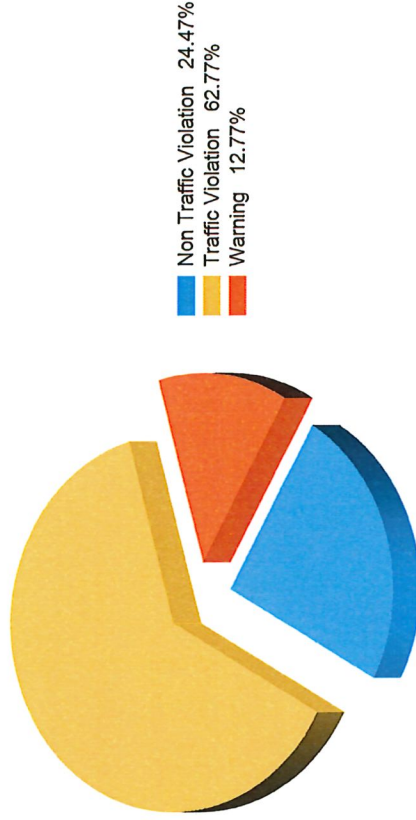

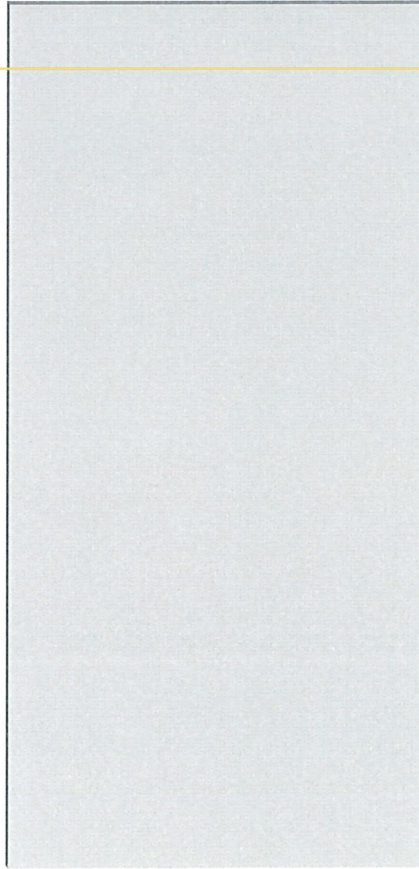

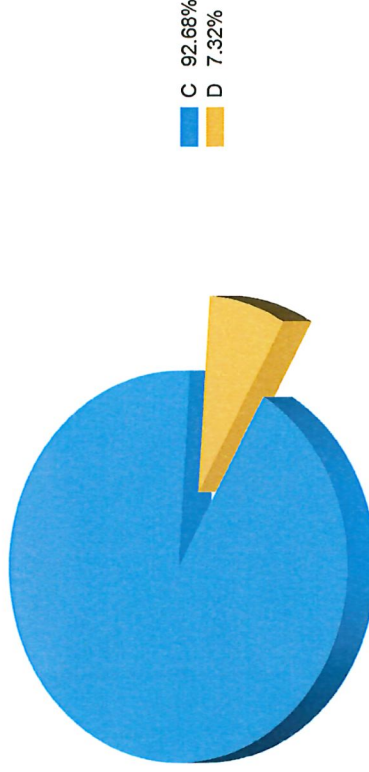

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Definitions

Basic Life Support Emergency (BLS Emergency)

When the ambulance provider or supplier is called, it responds immediately. The ambulance must be staffed by an individual who is qualified as an EMT-Basic per state guidelines.

Advanced Life Support (ALS)

An ALS assessment is an assessment performed by an ALS crew as part of an emergency response that was necessary because the patient's reported condition was such that only an ALS crew was qualified to perform the assessment. An ALS intervention must be medically necessary to qualify as an intervention for payment for an ALS level of service.

Advanced Life Support 1 Emergency (ALS 1 Emergency)

When medically necessary, the provision of ALS1 services (ALS assessment or ALS intervention per state guidelines), are performed in the context of an emergency response and responds immediately. ALS personnel are trained to the level of EMT-Intermediate or Paramedic.

Advanced Life Support 2 (ALS 2)

Transportation by ground ambulance vehicle staffed with ALS personnel and the provision of medically necessary supplies and services including:

1. At least three separate administrations of one or more medications by intravenous push/bolus or by continuous infusion (excluding crystalloid fluids),

OR

2. Ground ambulance transport, medically necessary supplies and services, and the provision of at least one of the following ALS 2 procedures:
 - a. Manual defibrillation/cardioversion;
 - b. Endotracheal intubation;
 - c. Central venous line;
 - d. Cardiac pacing;
 - e. Chest decompression;
 - f. Surgical airway; or
 - g. Intraosseous line.

Application: *Crystalloid fluids include fluids such as 5 percent Dextrose in water, Saline and Lactated Ringer's. Medications that are administered by other means (e.g., intramuscular/subcutaneous injection, oral, sublingually, or nebulized) do not qualify to determine whether the ALS2 level rate is payable. The criterion of multiple administrations of the same drug requires a suitable quantity and amount of time between administrations that is in accordance with standard medical practice guidelines.*

SUMMARY EXPLANATION:

We are requesting modification and additions to our Fire and EMS fee schedule.

- The costs of supplies, equipment, and personnel have and continue to increase substantially each year.
- Some items on the current fee schedule are outdated, while other items are non-existent.
- New State and Federal programs require a fee schedule to qualify for certain reimbursements.
- A full review of cost to provide services was completed in 2023 for the Center for Medicare Services (CMS) called the Ground Ambulance Data Collection System (GADCS).
 - Average cost per call is over \$2,000.
- **Updating fees does not guarantee an increase in payment.**
 - Medicare / Medicaid are fixed amounts.
 - State and Federal Reimbursements are fixed amounts.
 - Some calls are never paid, others are only partially paid.
 - Negotiated payments with billing company contract
- Significant reduction in man hours spent reviewing calls for billing purposes.
 - Currently Each call is reviewed prior to being billed, which takes approximately 5-7 minutes per call or 175 hours per year.
 - This update will reduce the time required to less than half.

As part of the negotiations with Paramedic Billing Services (The Fire Departments EMS Billing Agency), the Department was able to negotiate the same percentage cost share for Fire calls as EMS calls, which is 3%. For reference prior to changing companies our old company had a 7% fee for EMS, and an 18% fee for fire. The board approved this transfer in 2024.

Many of the EMS fees appear to have very significant increases. While the updated fees are generally an increased amount, the actual percent increase will vary from call to call. This is largely because the current billing method takes into account every supply used from linens and pillows, to IV's and medications. Whereas the recommended method all of the costs are seen in one line.

Updating fees is a challenging process that has taken a considerable amount of thought and time. In this process we have heavily weighed the impact on users, the increases in costs for services, and our unwavering commitment to the Village. The updated fees more accurately reflect the fire department's cost for service and will improve department capacity to apply for State and Federal reimbursements.

POLICY & PROCEDURE

1. Requests for outside premise extension shall be made in writing to the Village Clerk and shall identify the date(s), time(s) and description of area to be used.
 - a. If application is made with the renewal of a Class "B" Beer or "Class B" Liquor License, the outside premise description shall also be accurately described and included in the legal description of the licensed premises.
2. A drawing accurately describing the location of the outside premise shall be attached to the application. Such description shall include the dimensions and access points of the outside premise.
 - a. If this is a new or a change to a permanent outside extension, site plan approval is required from the Plan Commission. Contact the Village Community Development Department for an application form and required information.
3. NO ALCOHOL BEVERAGES shall be served or consumed and NO amplified sound or outdoor lighting, other than customary safety and security lighting, shall be permitted within an outdoor licensed premise between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. unless as otherwise authorized by the Village Board at the time of license issuance subject to such conditions found to be necessary to minimize the impact of such use upon surrounding properties including limiting the dates and times of operation and requiring technological reasonable steps to minimize noise and other impacts.
4. All applications shall be referred to the Police Chief and Fire Chief for review and recommendation.
5. All property owners within 300 feet of the proposed outside premise shall be notified of the pendency of application and the date(s), time(s) and location, when the request will be considered by the Public Safety Committee. This shall be done by first class mail, approximately 10 days prior to the scheduled meeting for original applications only
 - a. This is not required for renewal applications.
6. The Public Safety Committee shall review the request, consider the recommendations of the Police and Fire Chiefs, and make a recommendation to the Village Board regarding issuance.
7. It is preferred, but not required that access to the outside premise shall be from the interior of the licensed premises. There may be a fire exit in the outside premise but may not allow for access from the outside.
8. Fencing of the outside premise shall be considered on a case by case basis.

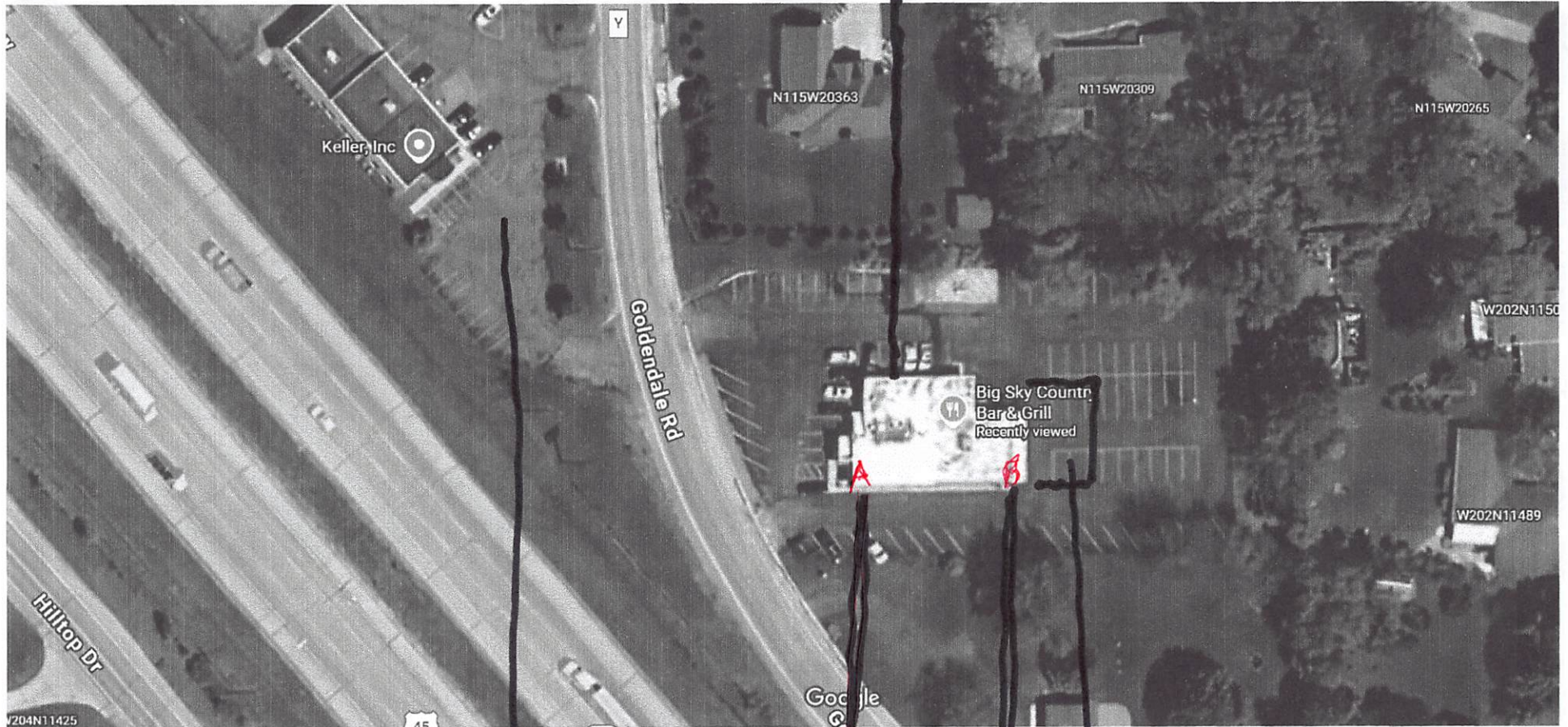

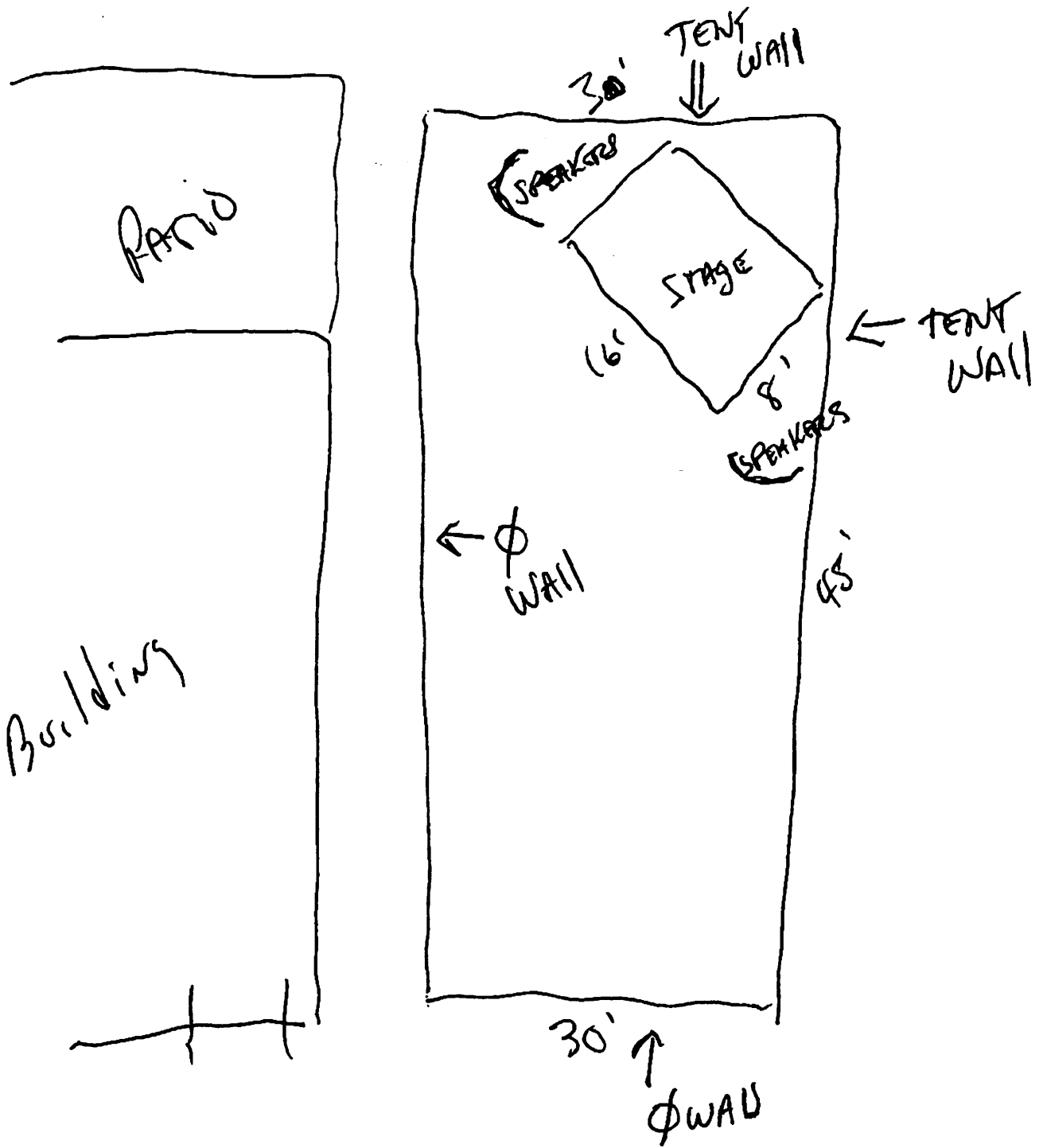

OUTDOOR ENTERTAINMENT PERMIT

POLICY & PROCEDURE

1. An Outdoor Entertainment Permit is required when the following types of entertainment are provided, wholly or in any part, including fixtures, attendees, and sound systems, outside of a fully enclosed permanent structure:
 - a. Amplified or non-amplified music, including live singers, musicians, bands, or orchestras, recorded music, karaoke, juke boxes, live DJ's, background music, radios, and the like.
 - b. Audio-visual broadcasts, including the presentation of live televised events such as a sporting event, television shows, movies and the like.
2. There are two types of outdoor entertainment permits:
 - a. Annual Permit: Allows the permittee to provide outdoor entertainment outside an enclosed structure during specified hours. The permit period is July 1 through June 30, with each year requiring a new permit.
 - b. Temporary Permit: Allows the permittee to provide activities outside an enclosed structure during a specified period or periods for special, limited occurrences.
3. Permit applications must be accompanied by a site plan and a scaled drawing or map showing the location of all speakers, televisions, performance locations, and the like.
4. Permit applications must be accompanied by a detailed plan of operation setting forth the dates, hours, location, type and scope of the operation for all outdoor entertainment activities. A complete plan of operation should include, as applicable: a description of the type of entertainment to be offered, a security plan (including the number of security personnel, how they will be utilized, how they are identified, etc.), a plan to handle control and clearance of the parking lot during hours of operation and at closing time, a plan for unruly patrons, intoxicated patrons, and physical disturbances, a plan of how alcohol sales and consumption will be addressed, a plan for litter and noise complaints, and contact information for an individual to address complaints at times entertainment is ongoing.
5. NO ALCOHOL BEVERAGES shall be served or consumed without appropriate licenses or permits.
6. All applications shall be referred to the Police Chief and Fire Chief for review and recommendation.
7. All property owners within 500 feet of the property to be subject to an Outdoor Entertainment Permit shall be notified of the pendency of application and the date(s), time(s) and location, when the request will be considered by the Public Safety Committee. This shall be done by first class mail, at least 15 days prior to the scheduled meeting.
8. The Public Safety Committee shall review the request, consider the recommendations of the Police and Fire Chiefs, and make a recommendation to the Village Board regarding issuance. The Village Board may impose conditions and restrictions on the permit found to be necessary to minimize the impact of the outdoor entertainment upon surrounding properties including limiting the dates and times of activities and requiring technologically reasonable steps to minimize noise and other impacts.

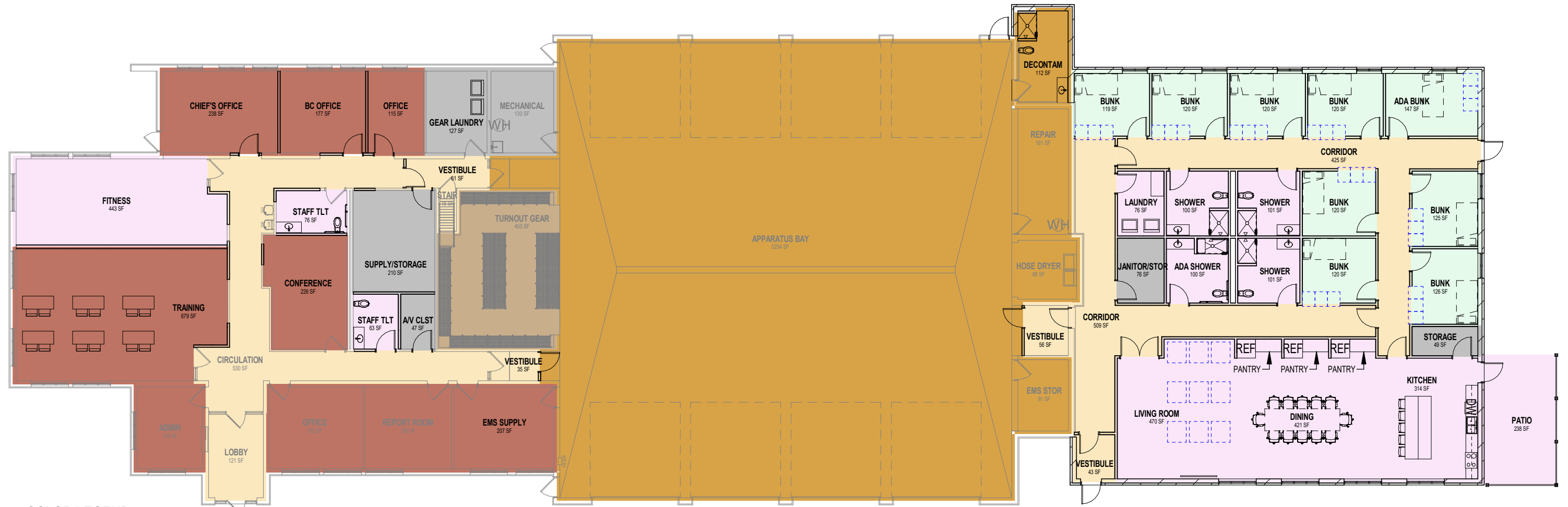
