MINUTES

- I. **CALL TO ORDER:** *This meeting has been given public notice in accordance with Section 19.83 and 19.84, Wis. Stats, in such form that will apprise the general public and news media of subject matter that is intended for consideration and action.*

Chairperson Cutts called the Public Safety Committee meeting to order at 6:00pm.

- II. **ROLL CALL:**

Present: Trustee Meg Cutts, Trustee Kristen Borst, Trustee Jolene Pieper was present via WebEx, Trustee David Baum arrived at 6:05pm

Also present: Police Chief Pat Merten, Fire Chief John Delain, Admin Manager Amy Lerch

- III. **CITIZEN INPUT:** *(Please be advised per 19.84(2) that information and comment will be received from the public. Lynne Bednarz (Pawnee Ct) commented against the expansion of Fire Station 2 and against the possibility of any high density development in the Village.

Melanie Smythe (Cedar Ln) commented on the GFD Station 2 expansion and the ongoing discussion of buildings above 3 stories. Can our Fire Dept handle taller buildings? (Chief Delain: Yes, up to 10-story buildings)

Sarah Larson (Butternut Rd) commented on the future development impacts to our Fire and Police: staff capacity, equipment needs, was this factored into the Referendum?

Jerry Siegle (County Line Rd) commented on drivers speeding on County Line Rd, interested in the traffic survey results.

Chairperson Cutts read an email received from the Schneiders voicing concerns of increases in billable services, Fire Station 2 expansion, and impacts of high density development on the Village.

Chairperson Cutts read an email received from Germantown Firefighters Local 4854 supporting the remodeling of the existing Fire Station 2, citing numerous issues and

concerns for the employees living and working in the facility.

Chairperson Cutts noted there will be an open house at Fire Station 2 on Edison Drive during National Fire Safety week, Thursday 10/16/25 from 5:30pm-8:00pm. This would be available in lieu of having a future Public Safety Meeting held at the Station.

V. REPORTS (Discussion Unless Otherwise Noted):

A. Police Monthly Report

Chief Merten provided a monthly report and additional information regarding: traffic and speeding incidents, high speed stops (pit maneuver), K9 workload included assisting Washington County and the State Patrol.

B. Fire Department Monthly Report

Chief Delain provided a monthly report and additional information regarding Mutual Aid: typically structure fire-related, instances given/received, related NFPA response times, non-hydranted locations using tender operations, and related staffing requirements.

C. Overtime Report

Chief Merten reported Dispatch and Seargent OT has been reduced, although shortages will continue until new hire training is completed after first of the year. Trustee Cutts asked for a comparison of the OT numbers year-over-year for the next PSC meeting. Trustee Baum asked about OT projections (Chief Merten: overall diminish throughout the rest of 2025).

Chief Delain reported GFD OT was up in July due to the new-hire academy (3 employees), shared numbers and comparisons from 2024. Trustee Baum questioned the impact of Senior Living facilities vs Multi Family facilities (Senior Living draws more time and resources from GFD). Chief Delain provided

history and response numbers, explained the differing "zones" in the Village (the Senior Living communities are their own Zone).

D. Policy Updates

No Policy updates from Police or Fire.

Chief Delain presented the proposed changes & additions to the Fee Schedule, along with background information and supporting data. In the past we had itemized billing, this proposed fee schedule is a simpler one-cost bill.

Trustee Borst asked for explanations of non-collection, and if that is absorbed by the residents (not an impact to the tax structure).

D. Renovation and Expansion of Fire Station 2 (ACTION)

Village Administrator Kreklow presented two options for the renovation of the existing Fire Station 2:
*Option 1: expand building to the EAST
*Option 2: expand building to the NORTH
Both options are an increased cost from last year (\$5.2 mil to \$6.5 mil). This had been included in the budgeting process of the 5 year Capitol Plan, and there has already been \$500,000 pre-approved to be used immediately.
Fire Chief John Delain offered his comments, experiences and a brief history as to the Station 2 growth and possible renovations.
Trustee Baum spoke in favor of Option 2 for future growth.
Trustee Borst asked about the futures of Station 2, would it remain in use (yes).
Administrator Kreklow recommended Option 1, and suggested this item be moved forward to the Village Board in some form relatively soon. It would not be part of the consent agenda, so as to discuss and vote on this separately.

F. Effect of High Density Development on Police/Fire/EMS Services.
(DISCUSSION)

Trustee Cutts asked the Chiefs for their input as to the impacts of future High Density development in the Village.
Chief Merten: Majority of call volume is the retail and big box stores, drug arrests, so it depends on the clientele that would live in these locations. Would not be much of an impact fo the GPD.
Chief Delain agreed that the impact to the GFD would be very small, as 23% of our call volume is related to 4 buildings (Senior Living Facilities: Gables, Virginia Highlands, Fairway Knoll and Frontida).

G. Results of Radar Tracking on County Line Road (DISCUSSION)

Chief Merten shared results from the one-week traffic study near Lannon and County Line; Speeds averaged between 30-55 mph.
Trustee Baum asked if there were any excessive speeds? (No)
Trustee Borst asked if there had been calls or complaints logged? (Yes)
Trustee Baum asked for jurisdiction information (Germantown, Washington County, Menomonee Falls, Waukesha County)
Trustee Borst asked for Menomonee Falls data to be presented at the next PSC meeting.
Trustee Pieper asked about the number of Police Officers we will be hiring (2) and who pays for the training (combined Village and State).

VIII. NEXT MEETING DATE:

The September Public Safety Meeting will be determined at a later date due to the Labor Day weekend.

Chairperson Cutts adjourned the meeting at 7:09PM.

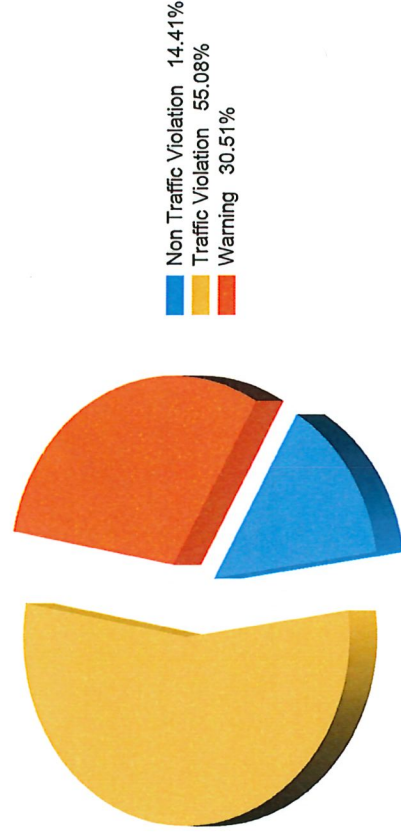

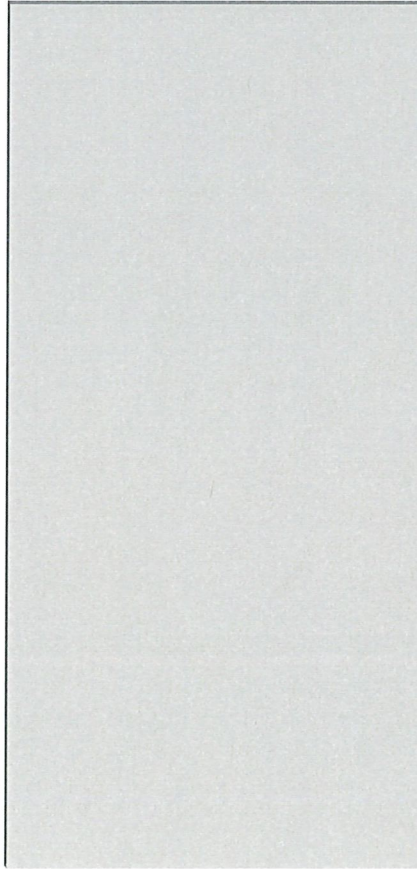

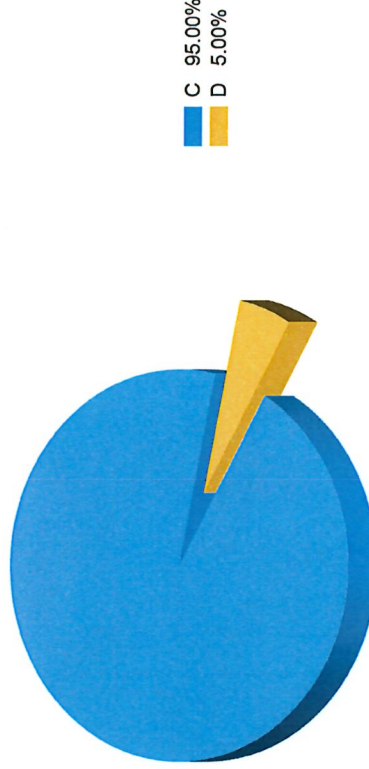

SUMMARY EXPLANATION:

The MOU for the SRO's expired on June 30, 2025. The new MOU will be from July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2027. There have been some change to the cost sharing portion of the agreement. The village agreed to 35% of the SRO wages and benefits, while Germantown School District agreed to pay 65% of the wages and benefits for 2 SRO's. One at the high school, and one at the middle school. The previous agreement was a 50% village and 50% school district for the cost-sharing.

The change in cost-sharing is due to the amount of time the SRO's spend working in the schools during the school year compared to assigned shifts worked during the summer months while school is not in session. SRO's track all of the time that they are at the schools, meetings, conferences, training, and sporting events related to the schools.

I believe this is a fair cost-sharing MOU where both parties benefit from the SRO's presence at the schools through the mirror presence of an officer, to building community relationships with students and teacher.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE VLLAGE OF GERMANTOWN
AND GERMANTOWN SCHOOL DISTRICT
REGARDNG SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER**

WHEREAS, units of local government are authorized to enter into cooperative intergovernmental agreements for the mutual benefit of their citizens pursuant to Section 66.0301, Wisconsin Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Germantown (Village) and Germantown School District (District) recognize the value of intergovernmental cooperation and efficient use of valuable community resources and have thus determined that a School Resource Officer will greatly assist in developing and fostering a positive relationship and rapport between youth and law enforcement, give students an opportunity to get acquainted with an Officer in an informal, nonauthoritarian setting, and educate on the role of law enforcement in society; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereby enter into the following Agreement, setting forth the terms, conditions and the relationship of the parties with respect to the creation and implementation of the School Resource Officer ("SRO").

1. **PURPOSE:** The purpose of this Intergovernmental Agreement is to set forth certain agreements and guiding principles for the implementation of the SRO position for the mutual benefit of the Village and the District, consistent with the mission statement for the SRO, and to provide governance and management of said SRO.

2. **MISSION OF THE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER:** The mission of the SRO is to help youth and adults of the Germantown community to view the police department as a "helping agency" with the responsibility to educate, protect and serve all citizens. The SRO will also focus on prevention of crime and prevention of school code violations in and around the Germantown School District.

3. **AUTHORITY OF SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER:** The SRO is authorized to investigate, report and follow up, as necessary, all complaints that occur on the grounds of Germantown Schools that lie within the boundaries of the Village. It shall be the responsibility of the District staff to investigate and prevent violations of school rules and regulations, and to administer school discipline. The SRO will have the discretion to make decisions regarding arrest or citations, and to refer specialized investigations to the Village of Germantown Police Department for further investigation and follow-up.

4. **APPOINTMENT:** The selection and continued assignment or reassignment of the SRO shall be at the sole discretion of the Village of Germantown Chief of Police. However, the

District Superintendent may request reassignment of the SRO when necessary for the good of and/or the orderly operation of the schools of the District, which request shall not be unreasonably denied by the Village of Germantown Chief of Police.

5. **COMMAND STRUCTURE:** The Village of Germantown will supply two full-time equivalent sworn, certified officers to act as a SRO while supporting all students and locations within the school district boundaries. The SRO's will remain at all times employees of the Village of Germantown Police Department and will report directly to the chain of command adopted by the Village of Germantown Police Department. The District Administrator may provide evaluative information regarding the performance of the SRO, and the Village of Germantown Chief of Police shall consider such information when making assignment or reassignment decisions.

6. **TERM OF AGREEMENT:** This agreement shall become effective on the 1st of July 2025 and shall stay in effect for a 2-year period terminating on the 30th of June 2027. Either party can terminate or request an amendment of the agreement with the thirty (30) day written notice to the other party.

7. **COST SHARING:** The parties shall jointly assume the cost of 2 full time equivalent SRO positions, with the Village paying thirty-five percent (35%) and the District paying sixty-five percent (65%) for 2025-2026, and the Village paying thirty-five percent (35%) and the District paying sixty-five percent (65%) for 2026-2027 of the aggregate costs for the salary, training, and all benefits for the SRO positions. The Village of Germantown Police Department and Germantown School District will meet following the 2025–2026 and 2026–2027 school years to review the cost-sharing percentages and determine if any adjustments are necessary. Any hours outside of the normal scheduled workday will be paid as time and one-half the officer's hourly rate. Each party will be responsible for their respective overtime hours as a result of the current capacity the SRO is working in. The Village shall administer and provide all benefits to which the SROs are entitled under collective bargaining agreements, and the Village's employment policies and practices. The Village shall invoice the District at monthly intervals with a breakdown of wages, benefits, training costs incurred, and overtime (used by the district). All invoices shall be due and payable within sixty (60) days after receipt. The Village agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the District harmless from any claims of any kind made by (i) a SRO in connection with his/her assignment or reassignment as a SRO; (ii) a SRO in connection with his/her discipline or termination by the Village; or (iii) any applicant for the position of SRO.

8. **ASSIGNMENT:** The normal scheduled hours of work for both SRO's are eight and one-half (8-1/2) consecutive hours a day. The SRO position normal work week shall be 5 on, 2 off followed by 5 on, 2 off followed by 4 on, 3 off and then repeating the cycle. The five-day work week would consist of working Monday through Friday and Saturday and Sunday off. The four-day work week would consist of working Monday through Thursday with Friday, Saturday and Sunday off. If the normal scheduled hours of work on a regularly scheduled work day are to be changed, the SRO, Chief of Police, and School District must agree that the entire eight and one-half (8-1/2) hour shift is moved, rather than split shifts or other partial shift changes. The Village of Germantown Police Department does, however, reserve the right to change the work

assignments for these SRO's provided the following protections are maintained per collective bargaining agreements:

- SRO's may not have a normally scheduled off day changed without their consent.
- If the hours of work on a regularly scheduled work day are to be changed, the entire eight and one-half (8-1/2) hour shift is moved, rather than split shifts or other partial shift changes.

9. GOVERNING LAW: The laws of the State of Wisconsin shall govern the validity, performance and enforcement of this Agreement. The rights and remedies herein granted are cumulative and are in addition to any given by statute, rule of law, or otherwise, and the use of one remedy shall not be taken to exclude or waive the right to use another.

10. AMENDMENT; WAIVER: No modification, amendment, waiver or release of any provisions of this Agreement or of any right, obligation, claim or cause of action arising hereunder shall be valid or binding for any purpose unless in writing and duly executed by all parties involved. The parties hereto agree and understand that from time to time changes to this document may be necessary due to the evolving nature and development of the team. As such, any modification to this agreement shall be in the form of an addendum, signed by all parties and subsequently attached hereto after execution.

11. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This Agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties hereto, and no agreement, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or be binding upon any of the parties hereto. This Agreement supersedes all other agreements relating to this subject involving the parties hereto.

12. BINDING EFFECT: This Agreement when fully executed shall be binding upon the respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the parties hereto.

13. AUTHORITY: Each party hereto represents and warrants that they have the right, power, legal capacity and authority to enter into and perform their respective obligations under this Agreement.

INTRODUCTION

This topic is on the Committee's agenda based upon two requests. The first came from a resident who has complaints about their neighbor mowing their lawn in the early morning hours. The second was a request by President Soderberg to provide greater understanding about the choice to utilize a subjective reasonableness standard for noise instead of an objective decibel limit. Both requests are discussed below.

DISCUSSION

I. Regulations related to outdoor power equipment.

Under the current noise ordinance,

(2) The following acts are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in violation of this section, but this enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive:

(c) The operation of any gas-powered outdoor power equipment such as lawn mowers, saws, hedge clippers, leaf blowers, snow removal equipment, and the like between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6 a.m., except that snow removal equipment may be operated at any time during the pendency of an official snow emergency and at any time within 24 hours following a snowfall of 2 inches or greater.

§ 9.07(2)(c). In other words, outdoor power equipment can be operated as early as 6 a.m. on most days. This time is different than the times allowed for construction tools/equipment, which is allowed as early as 7 am on weekdays and 8 am on weekends/holidays. This was done in recognition of the fact that yard maintenance is an ongoing requirement to avoid weeds, etc., and given differing schedules and that it is usually a once a week activity, more

time was allowed for power equipment. Note, these regulations do not apply directly to golf courses, which are more generally permissive under § 9.07(9)(d).

If the Committee desires to adjust the timing, a proposed ordinance could be brought back to the Committee next month.

II. Objective vs Subjective Standard

President Soderberg asked for a review of two aspects of our noise ordinance. Specifically, the request was to conduct a survey of other communities to determine whether they use a subjective reasonableness standard or an objective (decibel-based) standard for noise disturbances. Under the objective standard, ordinance enforcers utilize specialized devices to measure the alleged noise violation. A violation occurs when noise exceeds the ordinance's decibel limit. In every objective standard, the maximum decibel levels vary by a combination of zone, duration of the noise, type of noise, or time of day. The second aspect of the request centered on what would be required if the Village adopted an objective standard. If the Village were to adopt an objective standard, it would be the only municipality in Washington County to do so and would be in the minority state-wide as well. Further, adopting an objective standard would require additional training and equipment expenses

for the individuals tasked with enforcing the code.

A. A large majority of the communities surveyed use a subjective standard in their noise ordinances.

Of the 43 Wisconsin municipalities surveyed, 30 have subjective standard (i.e., based on reasonableness), 8 have objective standard (i.e., based on decibels), and 4 have mixed standard noise ordinances. One municipality had no general noise ordinance. Most of the municipalities apply their respective standard to all noise.¹ There are a few mixed-standard municipalities which generally have subjective standards for most noises alongside objective standards for certain noise sources. Waunakee, for example, supplements its generally subjective standard with objective standards for construction, industry, and stationary noise sources.

About 19% of the municipalities surveyed utilize an objective standard to enforce their noise ordinance. The objective standard municipalities have relatively high populations (e.g., Milwaukee, Madison, Oshkosh, La Crosse, Franklin), especially when compared to the subjective standard municipalities.

The Village of Germantown would be an outlier within the state, and the county more locally, if it adopted an objective standard. Of the municipalities surveyed in Washington County, 100% utilize a subjective standard to enforce their noise ordinance. This includes Hartford, Jackson, Kewaskum, Richfield, Slinger, and West Bend.

B. Municipalities with objective noise ordinances should be prepared to provide expert testimony when submitting sound level meter measurements as evidence.

Municipalities with objective noise ordinances should be prepared to provide expert testimony when submitting sound level meter measurement as evidence. It is true that requiring expert testimony is an “‘extraordinary step’” for when “‘the issues before the jury are ‘unusually complex or esoteric.’” *State v. Kandutsch*, 2011 WI 78, ¶128, 336 Wis. 2d 478, 799 N.W.2d 865 (citations omitted). As such, if an “‘issue can be determined ‘by common knowledge’ the circuit court should allow the issue to go to a jury without first requiring expert testimony.” *Id.* ¶129 (citation omitted). In this case, expert testimony may not be

¹ Most ordinances have some exemptions/exceptions (e.g., emergency equipment, Oktoberfest).

required if the court finds that the sound level meter is a standardized method that carries a *prima facie* presumption of accuracy. *See, e.g., Kandutsch*, 2011 WI 78, ¶¶43-46 (citing *State v. Hanson*, 85 Wis. 2d 233, 244-45, 270 N.W.2d 212 (1978)) (electronic monitoring devices and speed radars); *see also Brook Park v. Rodojev*, 161 N.E.3d 511, 515 (Ohio 2020) (citing *E. Cleveland v. Ferell*, 154 N.E.2d 630, 633 (Ohio 1958)) (laser speed-measuring devices, photographs, X-rays, electroencephalographs, and speedometers). However, no courts have expressly adopted sound meters as a standardized method. Because the requirement of expert testimony is a discretionary decision by the court and no current Wisconsin case addresses the reliability of sound level meters, municipalities with objective noise ordinances should be prepared to provide expert testimony.

1. Expert witness testimony is assessed under the Daubert Standard.

When expert testimony is at issue, courts use the Daubert Standard to assess whether the testimony is reliable and relevant enough to present to the jury. *Daubert v. Merrell Dow Pharms., Inc.*, 509 U.S. 579, 592-93 (1993). Wisconsin adopted the Daubert Standard in 2011 by amending Wis. Stat. § 907.02 (2023-24), which also mirrors Fed. R. Evid. 702.² The Daubert Standard is a tool the circuit court uses in its role as gatekeeper of evidence, specifically of expert testimony evidence. *Id.* at 597. Courts will only accept expert witness testimony that is reliable, relevant to the issue, and from a qualified witness. *State v. Hogan*, 2021 WI App 24, ¶19, 397 Wis. 2d 171, 959 N.W.2d 658. The proponent must establish admissibility by a preponderance of proof. *Daubert*, 509 U.S. at 592 n. 10. Only the reliability determination is new to the expert testimony standard; the latter two determinations were required under the pre-amendment statute. *State v. Jones*, 2018 WI 44, ¶30, 381 Wis. 2d 284, 911 N.W.2d 97.

Expert witness testimony is only relevant if it “assist[s] the trier of fact to understand the evidence or to determine a fact in issue.” Wis. Stat. § 907.02(1). Testimony is relevant when it is “sufficiently tied to the facts of the case” such that “it will aid the jury in resolving a factual dispute.” *Daubert*, 509 U.S. at 591 (citation omitted). Testimony aids the jury when it “concerns a matter beyond the understanding of the average person, assists the jury in

² Wis. Stat. § 907.02 (2023-24): (1) If scientific, technical, or other specialized knowledge will assist the trier of fact to understand the evidence or to determine a fact in issue, a witness qualified as an expert by knowledge, skill, experience, training, or education, may testify thereto in the form of an opinion or otherwise, if the testimony is based upon sufficient facts or data, the testimony is the product of reliable principles and methods, and the witness has applied the principles and methods reliably to the facts of the case. (2) Notwithstanding sub. (1), the testimony of an expert witness may not be admitted if the expert witness is entitled to receive any compensation contingent on the outcome of any claim or case with respect to which the testimony is being offered.

understanding facts at issue, or puts the facts in context.” *State v. Dobbs*, 2020 WI 63, ¶144, 392 Wis. 2d 505, 945 N.W.2d 609 (citation omitted).

Additionally, the witness must be “qualified as an expert by knowledge, skill, experience, training, or education.” Wis. Stat. § 907.02(1). Police officers, for example, may testify as experts when their testimony regards “a matter which police officers regularly consider in the ordinary course of their duties” or when they have “the requisite training and experience to render an expert opinion.” *Brain v. Mann*, 129 Wis. 2d 447, 454, 385 N.W.2d 227 (1986). Thus, officers regularly qualify under this standard when their testimony is based on their police training or practical experience while working as a police officer. *Compare id.* at 453-54 (officer’s training and experience in accident investigations qualified him to serve as an expert witness regarding appropriately safe speed in construction zones), *with Milwaukee v. Bub*, 18 Wis. 2d 216, 224, 118 N.W.2d 123 (1962) (officer’s training and experience with accidents did not qualify him to serve as an expert witness regarding the point of impact in an accident because the officer lacked the “high degree of training” that such a determination required).

Finally, under the Daubert Standard’s reliability prong, the court must consider “whether the reasoning or methodology underlying the testimony is scientifically valid.” *Daubert*, 509 U.S. at 597. The court generally considers the following factors to determine whether the proposed expert testimony is reliable: “whether the theory or technique employed by the expert is generally accepted in the relevant community; whether it has been subject to peer review and publication; whether it has been tested and whether the known or potential rate of error is acceptable.” *State v. Chitwood*, 2016 WI App 36, ¶135, 369 Wis. 2d 132, 879 N.W.2d 786 (citing *Kumho Tire Co. v. Carmichael*, 526 U.S. 137, 149-50 (1999); *Daubert*, 509 U.S. at 593-94). Testimony will be considered reliable when the underlying reasoning or methodology is peer reviewed, tested, and has a known and acceptable error rate. *Id.*

2. If expert witness testimony is required to admit sound level meter measurements, a trained police officer or acoustic specialist may serve as the expert, depending on the kind of testimony required.

Under an objective noise ordinance, the Village may be subject to the Daubert Standard in at least two circumstances. First, the Daubert Standard will apply if expert testimony is required to establish the accuracy and reliability of sound level meter evidence. *See Kadutsch*, 2011 WI 78, ¶134 (citing *State v. Doerr*, 229 Wis. 2d 616, 624-25, 599 N.W.2d 897 (Ct. App. 1999)). If courts treat sound level meters like speed radar, it may not require expert testimony to admit the measurement as evidence. Second, the Daubert Standard will apply if the Village provides testimony regarding the sound level meter or its evidence that is based on scientific, technical, or specialized knowledge. *See Chitwood*, 2016 WI App 36, ¶134. This

may not apply because, like with speed radar, laying the foundation for sound level meter evidence should not be unusually complex and thus trigger expert testimony. Regardless, the court may determine that expert testimony would become relevant in either instance to “assist the trier of fact to understand the evidence or to determine a fact in issue.” Wis. Stat. § 907.02(1).

Even if the court does not require expert testimony regarding the sound level meter measurements, the Village will still need to provide the appropriate foundation. In order to do that, a police officer with specific training in or experience with sound level meters should be qualified to testify to their technical knowledge of the meter’s function, maintenance, and use in accordance with the appropriate standards and ordinance. This would include having knowledge as to how the device’s accuracy is certified and when it’s certification history, much like speed radar or the breath test machines used in operating under the influence cases. However, unlike the radar units and breath test machines which have training incorporated into regular training activities, there is no standard training for sound machines. As such, the department would be required to send officers to special training for these devices, at an additional cost. Moreover, if the court determines that an officer is not qualified to testify to significant scientific theories of sound measurement or inner workings of sound level meters because such expertise requires a higher degree of knowledge than is developed by police officer’s training in or use of sound level meters, the Village would need to hire a specialist, such as an acoustician or acoustic engineer, to serve as their expert witness.

CONCLUSION

Because of the uncertainty about the need for expert testimony for enforcement, and because of the increased training requirements and associated cost that would be required even if expert testimony is not deemed necessary by the courts, it remains my recommendation that the subjective standard be utilized. These concerns are likely why most municipalities continue to utilize a subjective standard as well.
