Lynne Bednarez (Pawnee Ct) spoke on the dangers on Pilgrim Road, traffic flow dangerous to cross traffic.

Scott Hefle (Old Farm Rd) spoke on the Flower Source property and what updates are available to the public.

Chairperson Cutts read an email from Brad Schlag on behalf of his parents Bob & Sandy Schlag (Sante Fe Dr) in opposition of the continued daily weather siren testing. Suggested one test per month.

Chairperson Cutts read an email from Bill & Carol Schneider regarding the Flower Source property and it's safety, and looking for more updates as to where the project is at. Questioned why the Village Building Oversight Committee isn't reviewing or participating in the Police Dept building project?

A. Police Monthly Report

Chief Merten provided the monthly GPD report and additional information: monthly arrests, citations, warrants, traffic stops are up from this time last year.

Trustee Baum asked if the numbers are up because we have more staff or we're just busier? (more activity in the Village)

B. Fire Department Monthly Report

Chief Delain provided the monthly GFD report and additional information: all incident numbers are tracking within the usual trend, structure fire in the Village that displaced the homeowner.

Trustee Baum asked about highest activity Zone, is it still the senior facilities? (Yes)

C. Overtime Report

Chief Merten reported the Police Union OT was up, and SGT OT down, versus this time last year.

Chief Delain reported the overall GFD OT is down, the second lowest month of the past year.

D. Policy Updates

There were no policy updates from Police or Fire.

VI. UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

A. *Discussion on the Village's Emergency Alert Sirens Testing Procedures (DISCUSSION)*

Grant has been applied for, we're waiting to see if we will get the monies (early DEC timeframe). The grant will pay for 50% of the remote software upgrade, no other additions (hardware, batteries, etc.) (total will be \$100,000).

Trustee Pieper led a discussion regarding the batteries, cost, testing procedures. Chief Merten explained the various test options: growl test, weekly or monthly, remove the daily testing.

Chief Merten stated the siren testing schedule can be changed without committee approval as it's dependent on available personnel.

B. *Discussion on Noise Ordinance Enforcement (DISCUSSION)*

Chief Merten presented noise complaint statistics for the past year. Committee discussion ensued, it was deemed to be a topic that does not have enough complaint activity to warrant changing the ordinance. No further discussion or action at this time.

Chief Merten presented call history for the former Flower Source property. Of 61 calls over nearly 2 years, 5 were found to be valid concerns.

Trustee Pieper suggested the Village President follow-up with the Village Administrator regarding the demolition process and timeline.

Administrator Steve Kreklow stepped forward to provide information regarding: the draft of the grant application has been sent, they are reviewing the draft, an asbestos check needs to be done, the Village already has quotes for moving forward.

This item will be placed on the next meeting Agenda as an action item (to be forwarded to the Village Board for approval of funds to be used to complete the demolition of the Flower Source buildings & property).

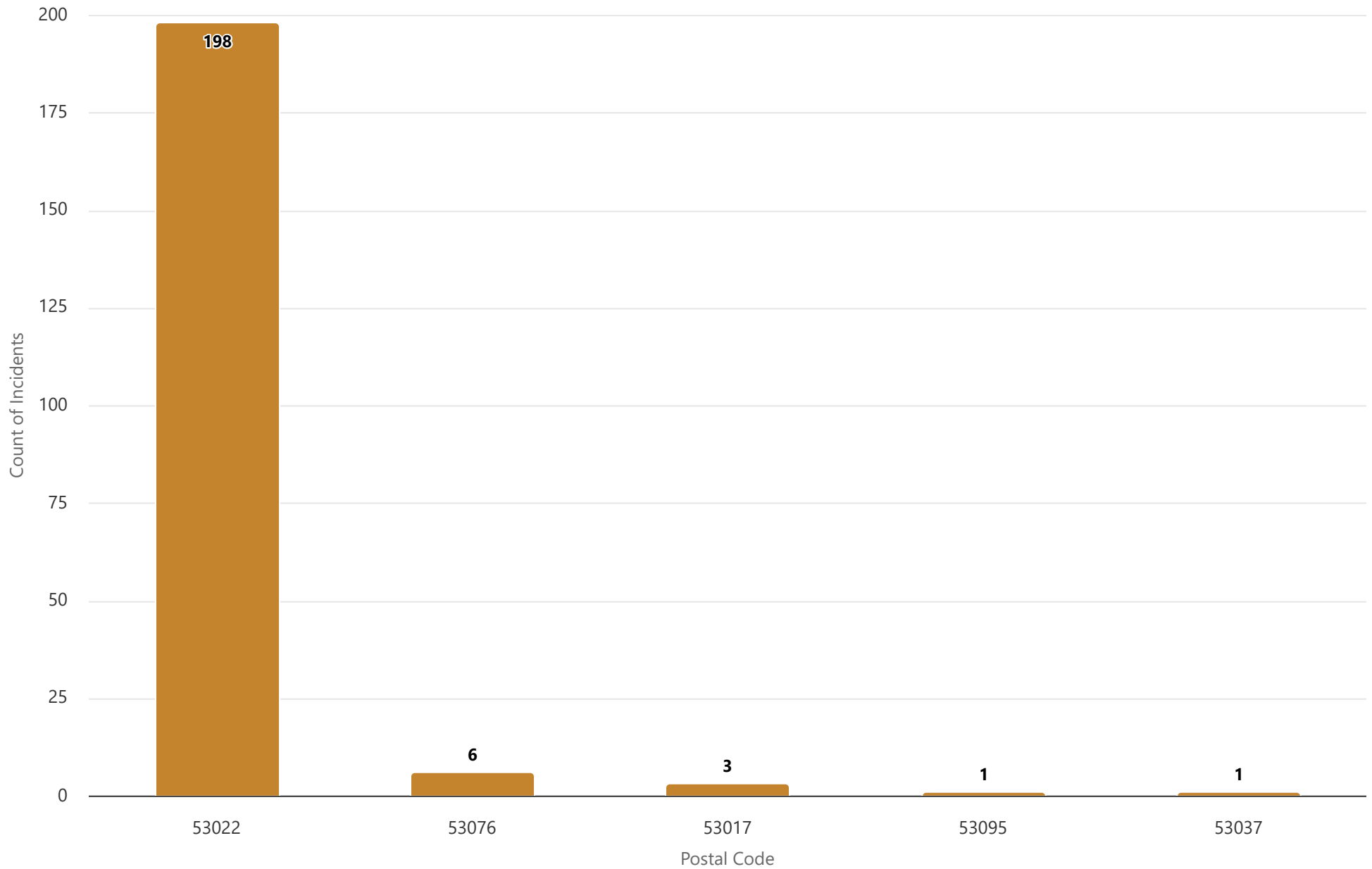
Scene Locations of Fire Incidents

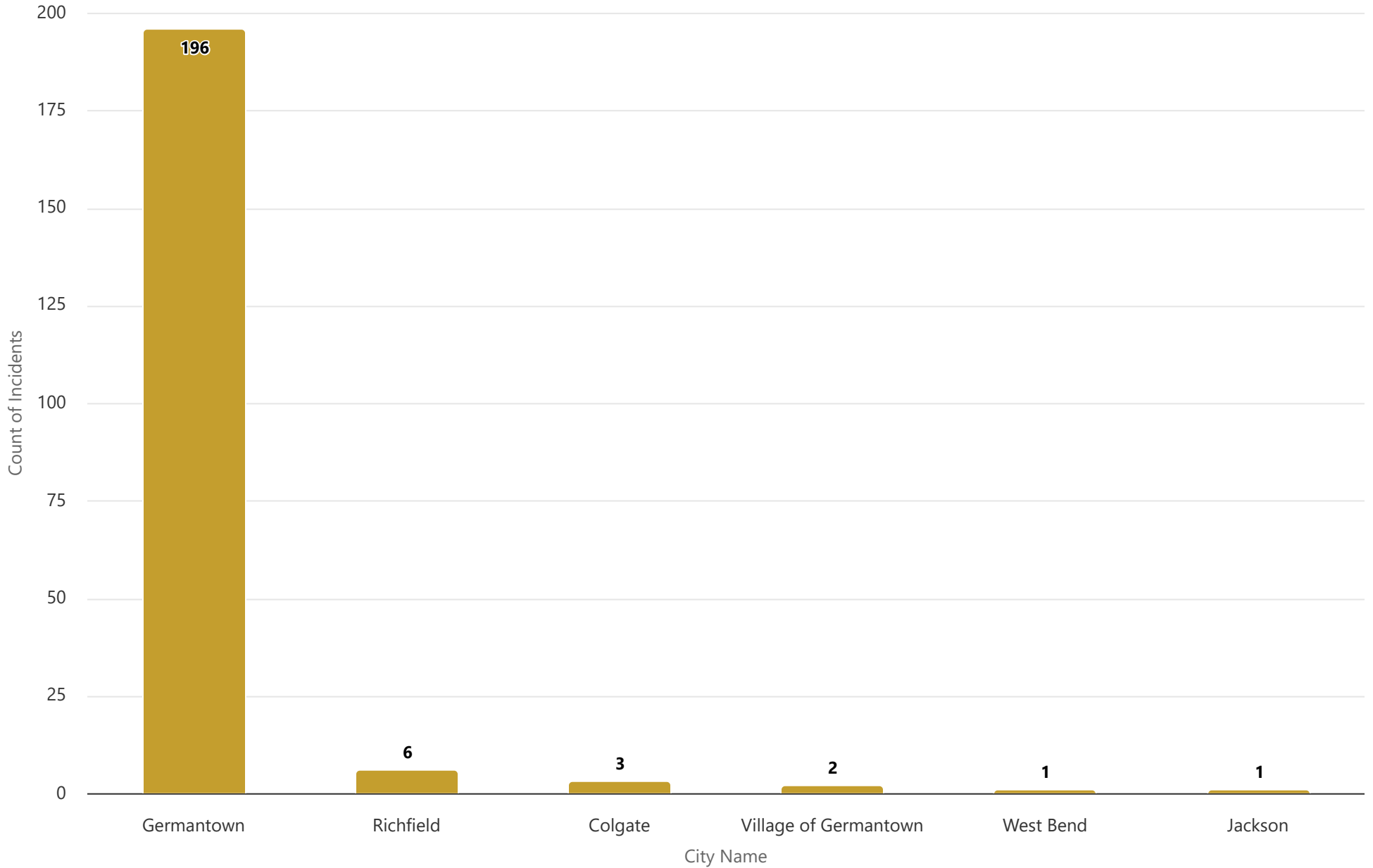
Incidents by Postal Code

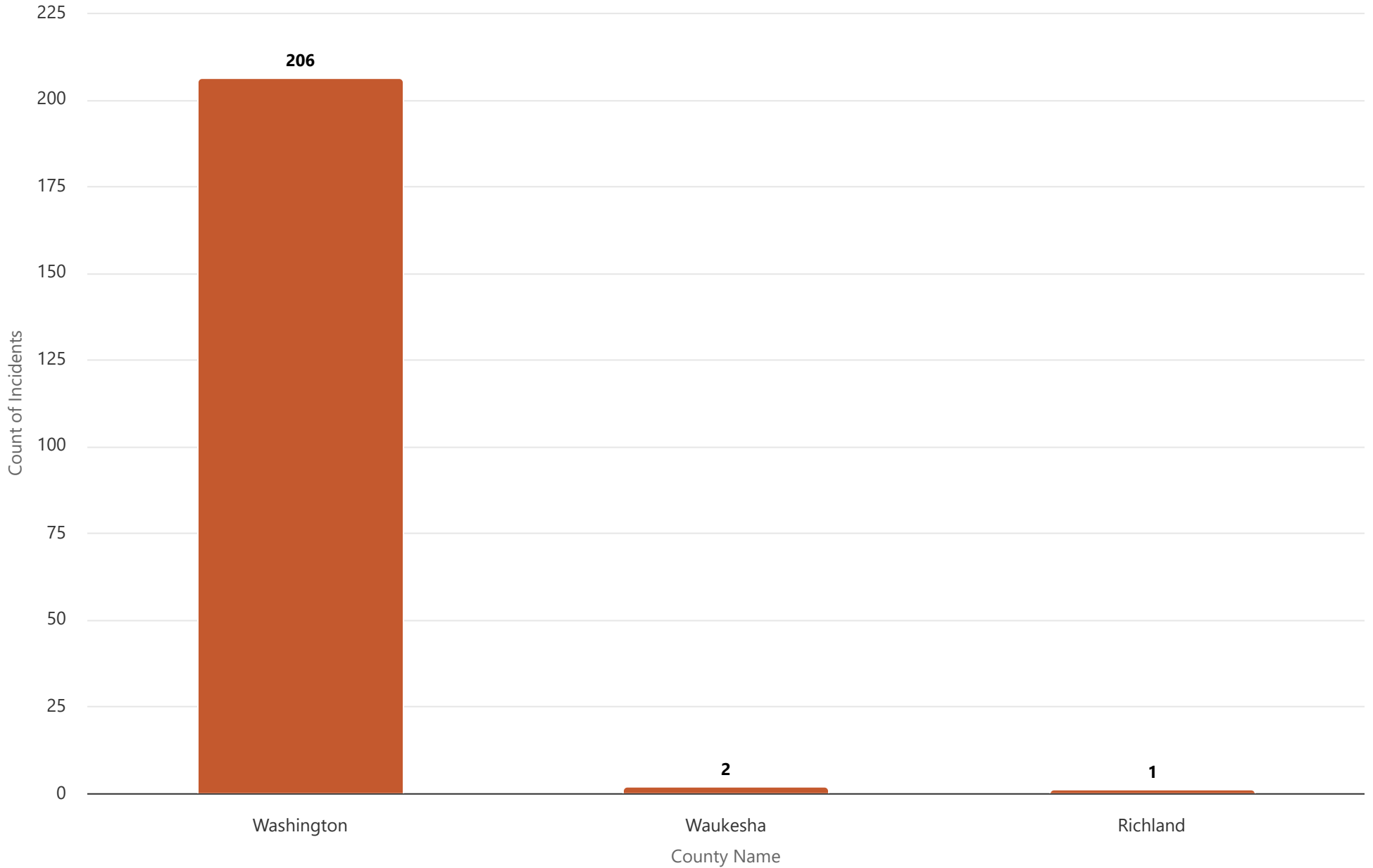
Incidents by City Name (Top 15)

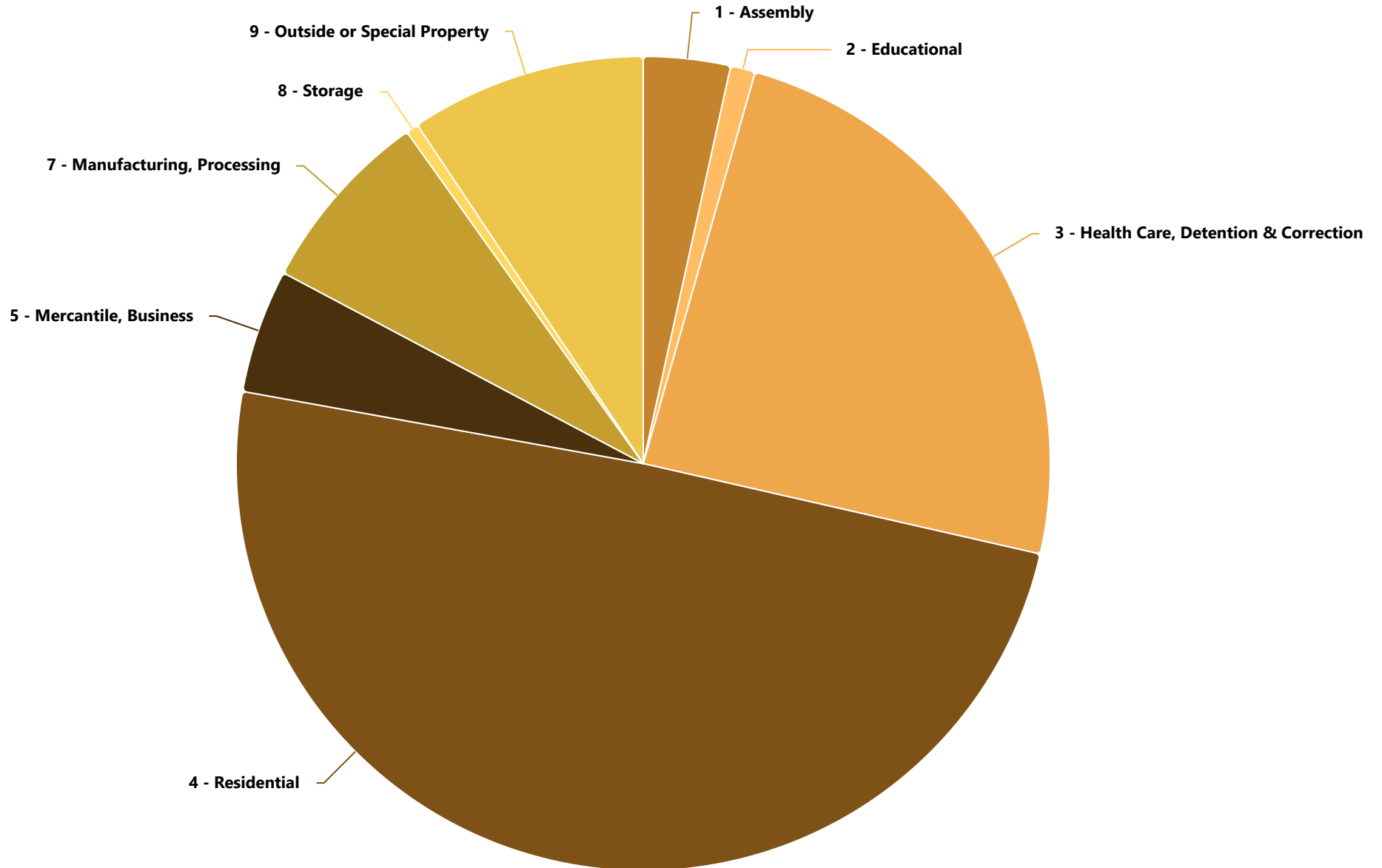
Incidents by County Name (Top 15)

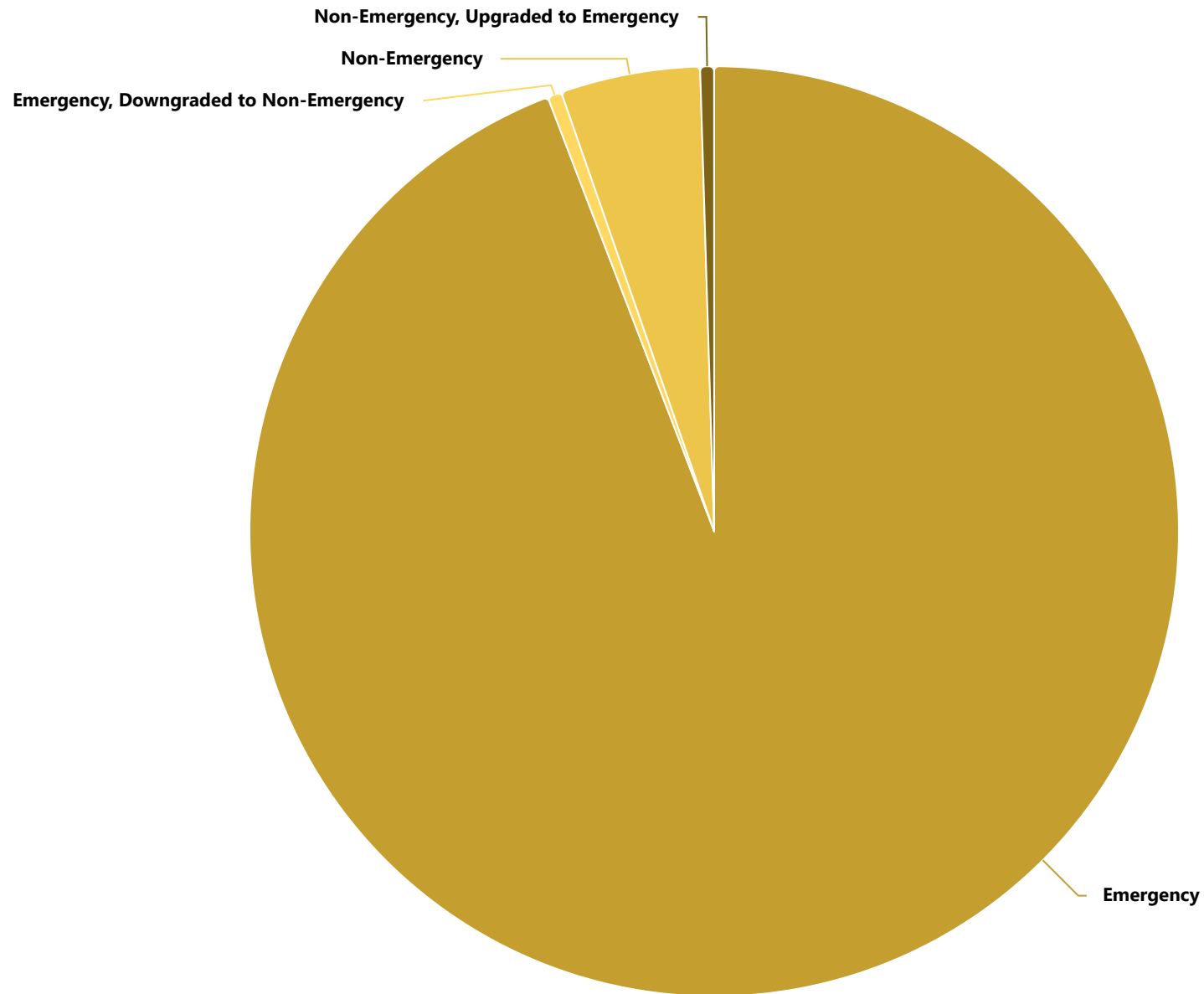
Incidents by Property Use Category

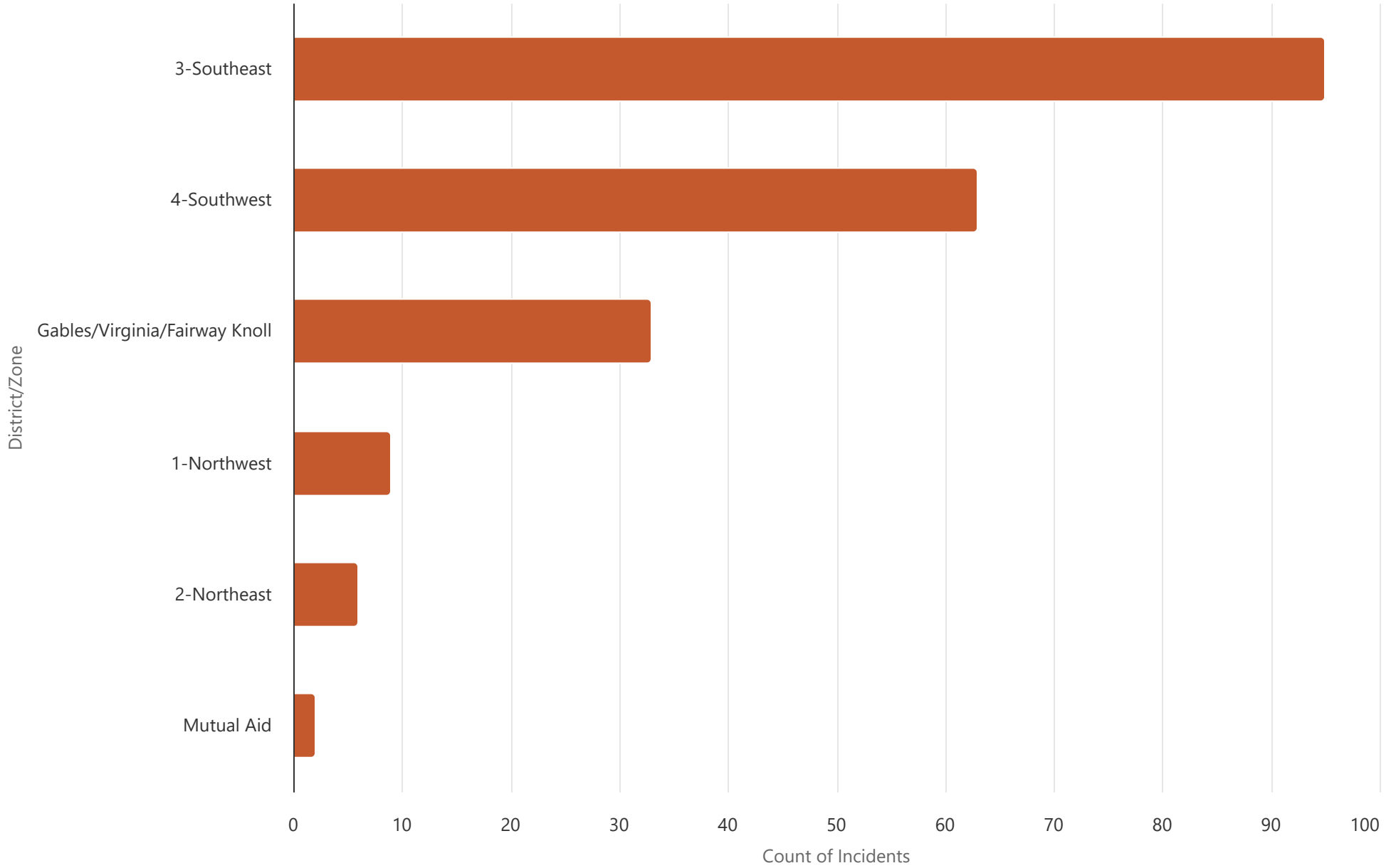
Incidents by Response Mode To Scene

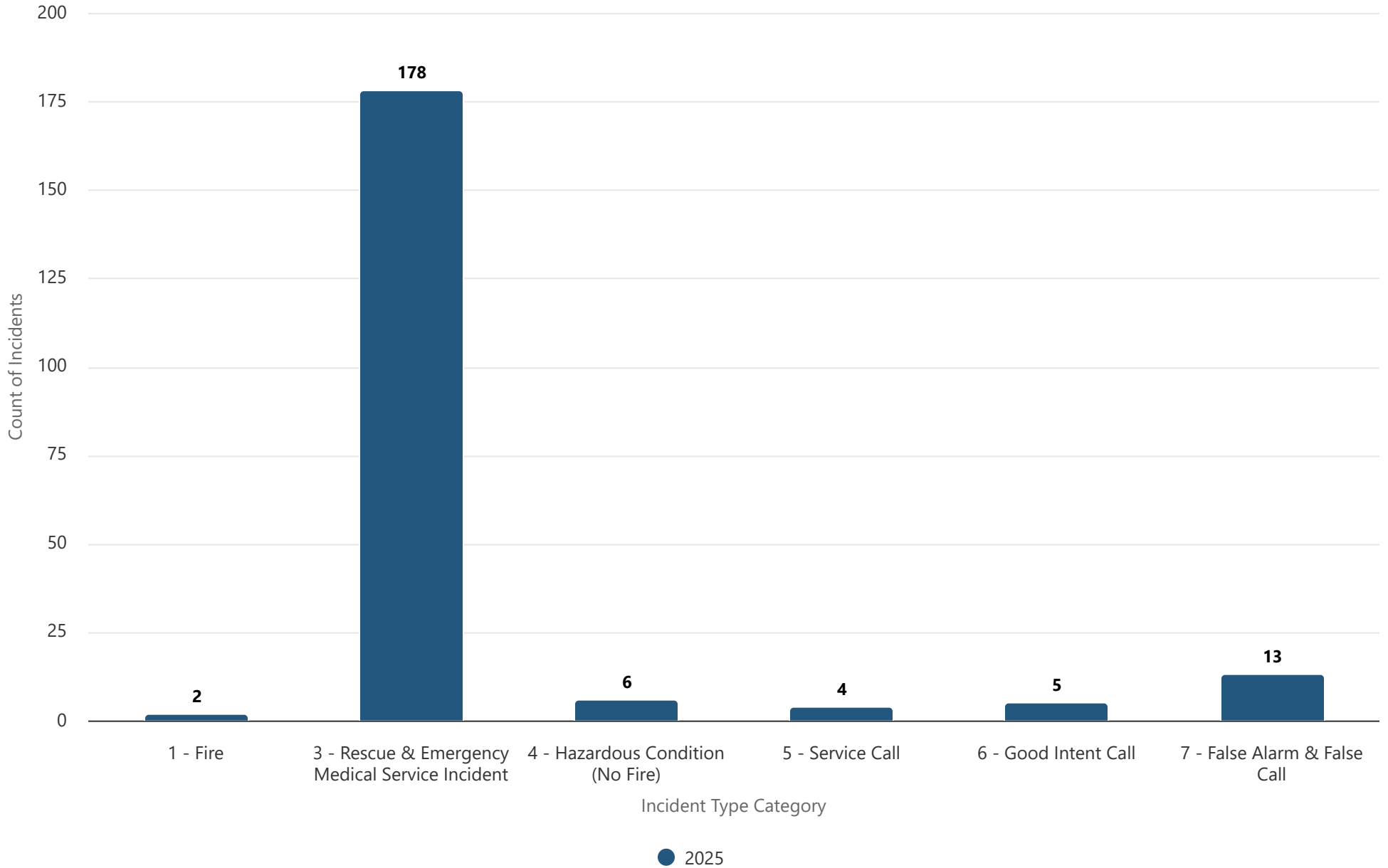

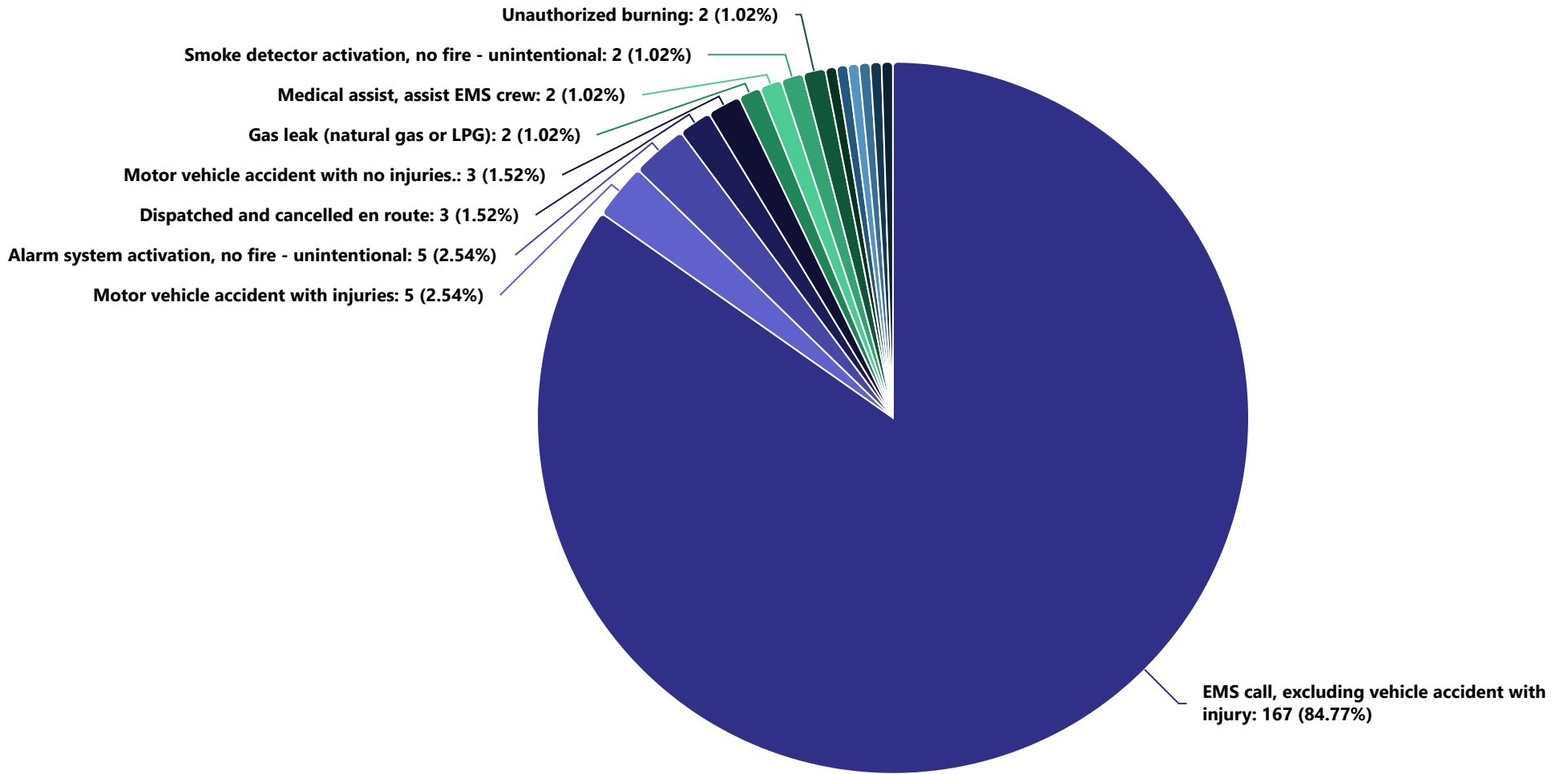
Incidents by Category and Year

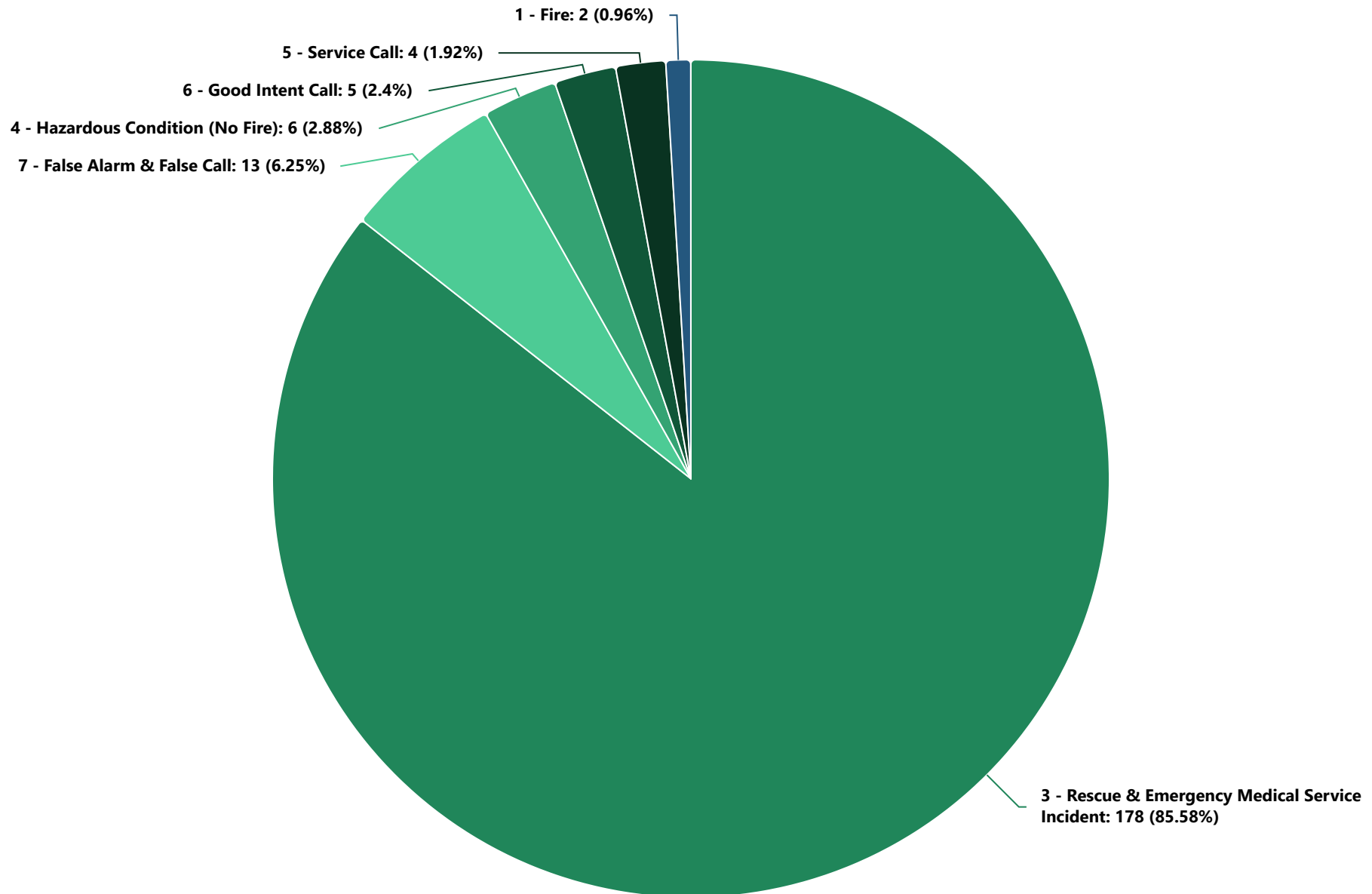
Incident Types (Top 15)

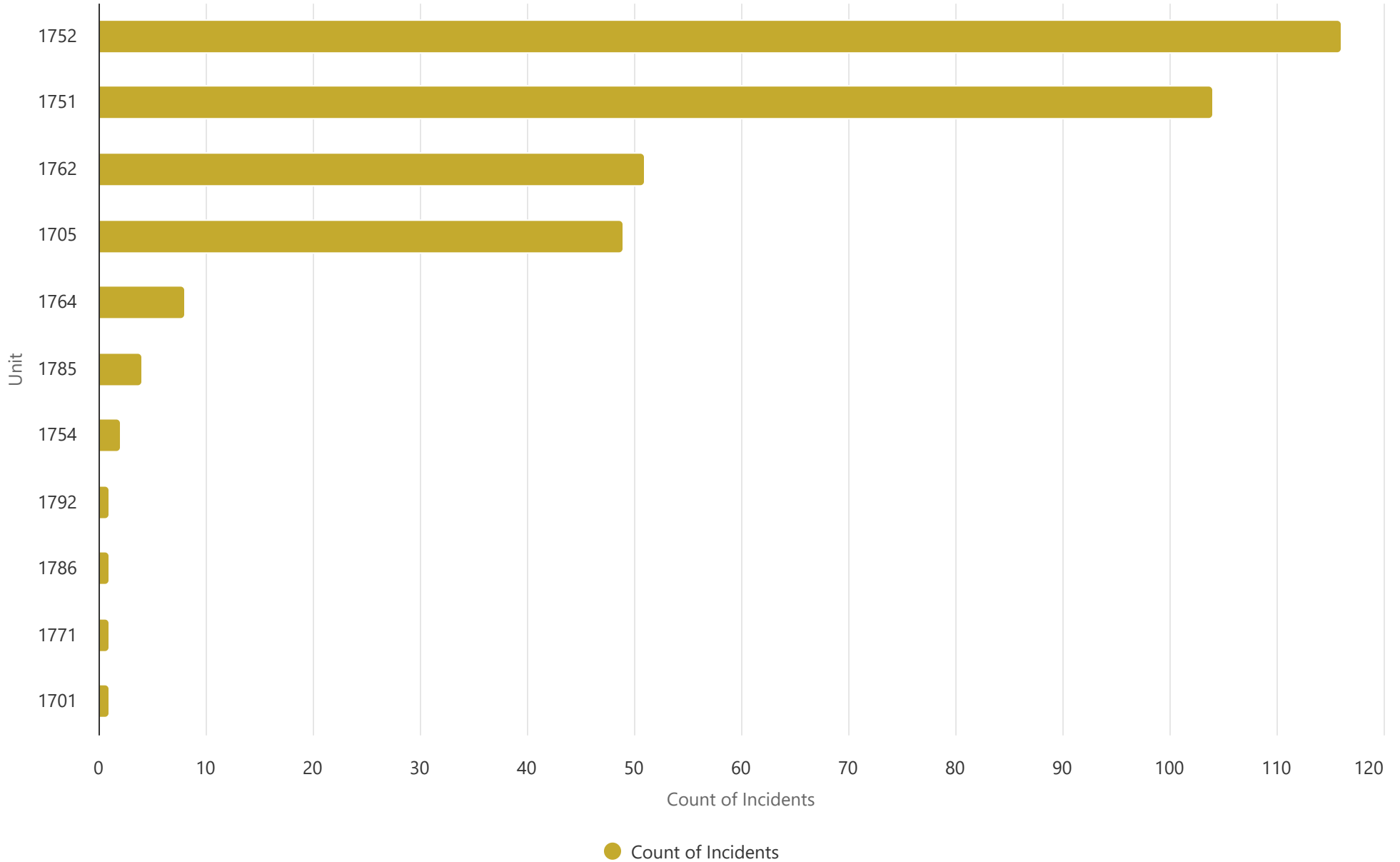

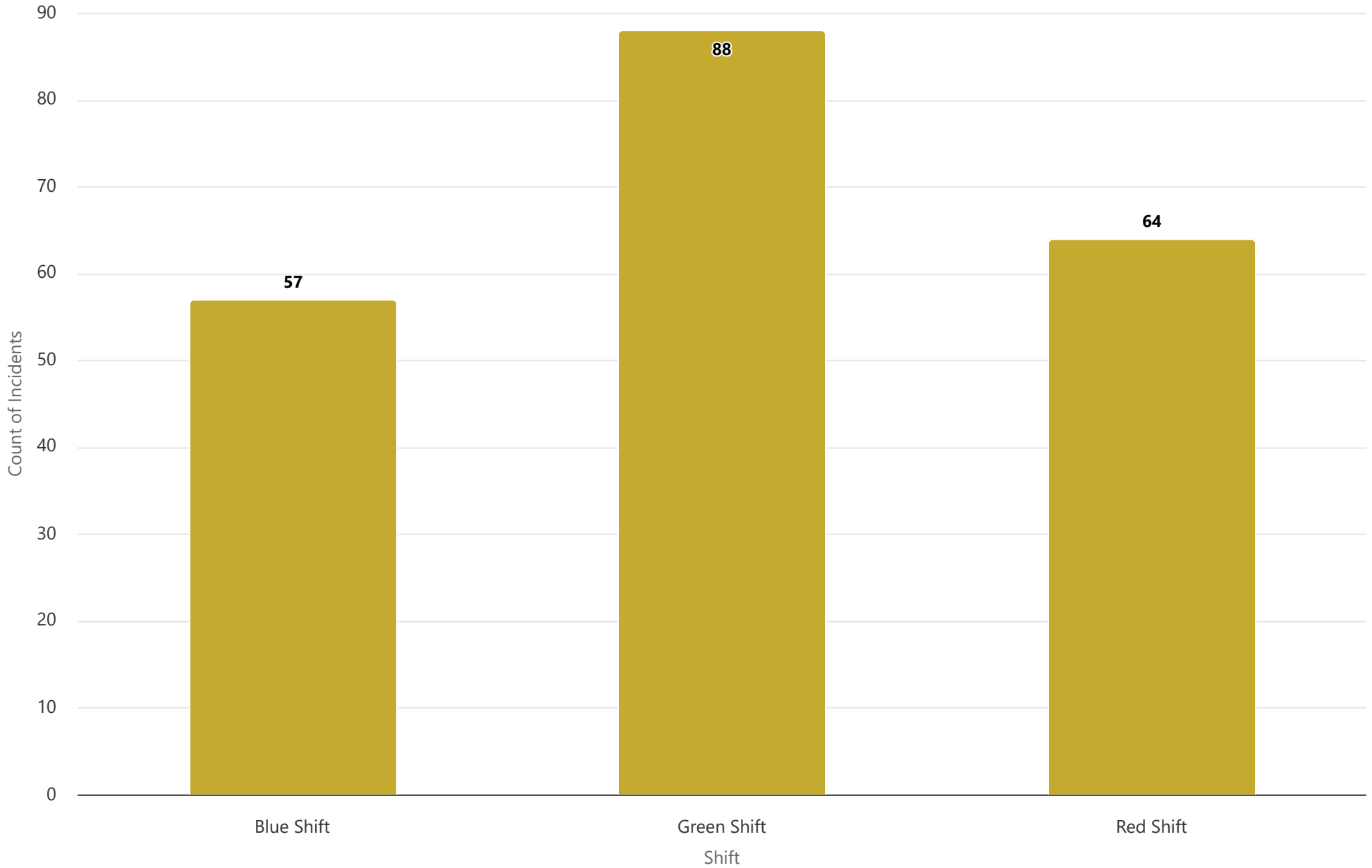

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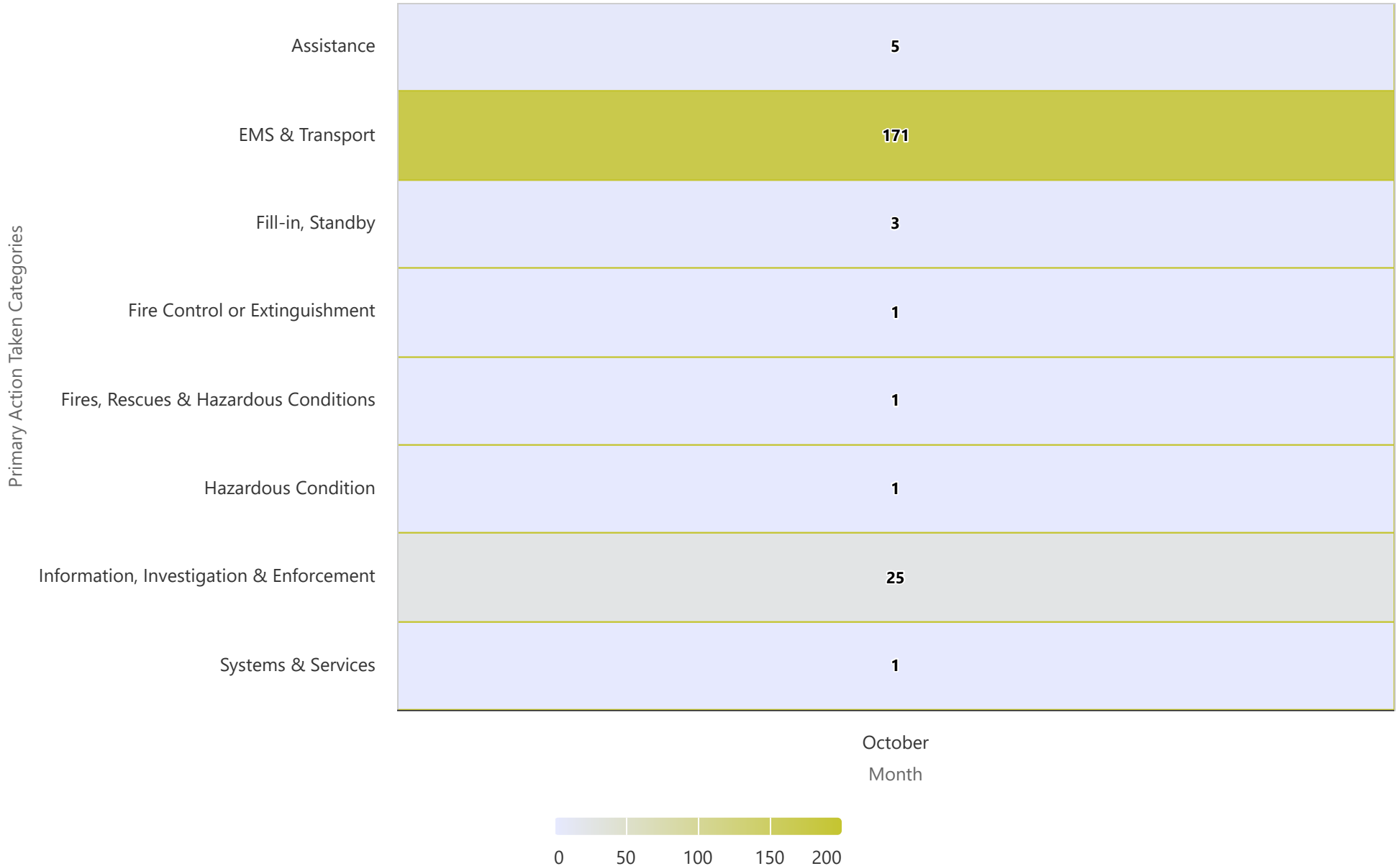

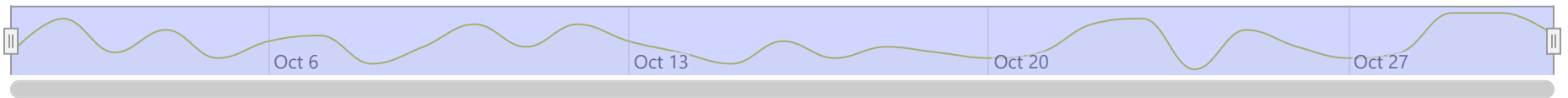
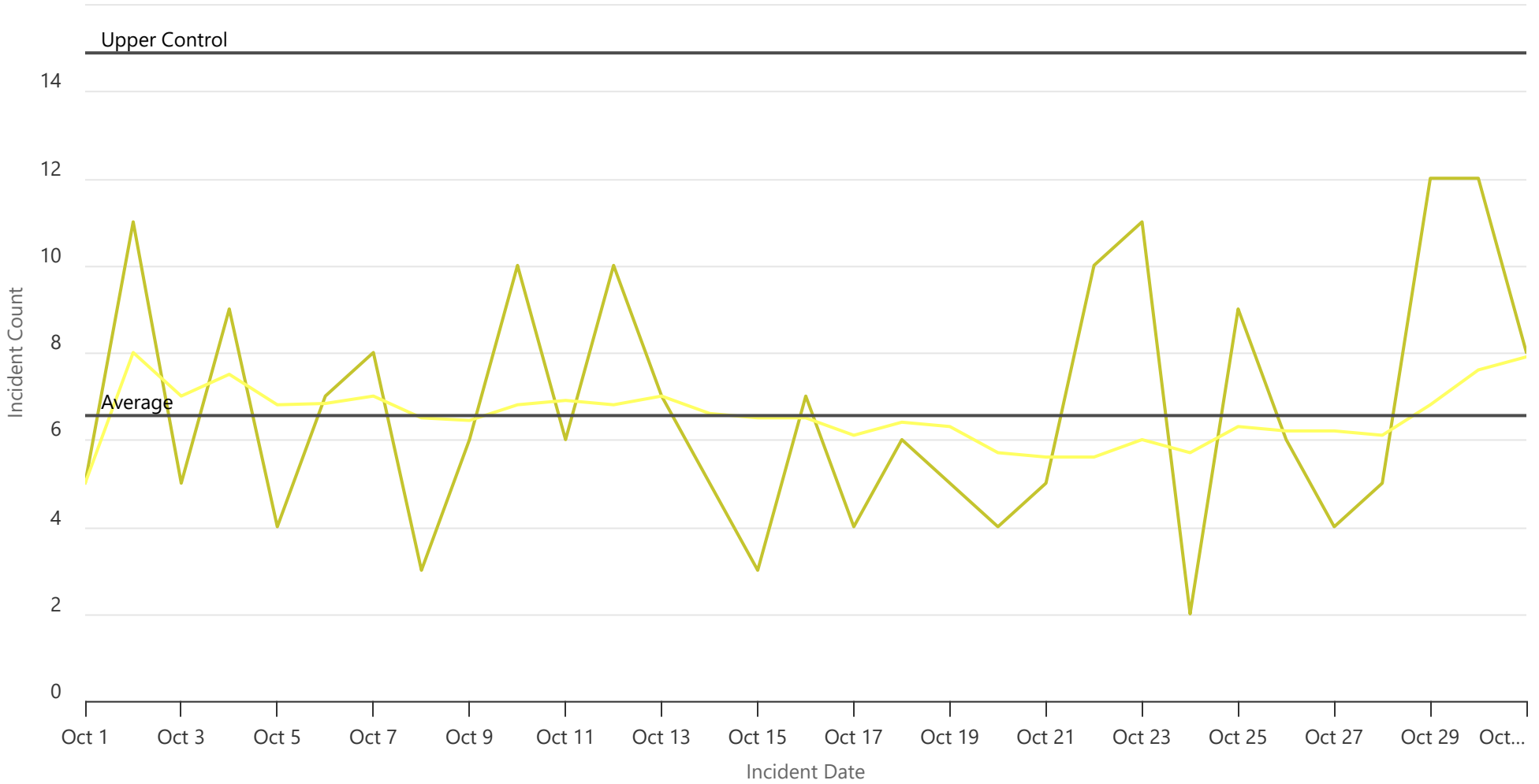
Fire Call Volume by Week

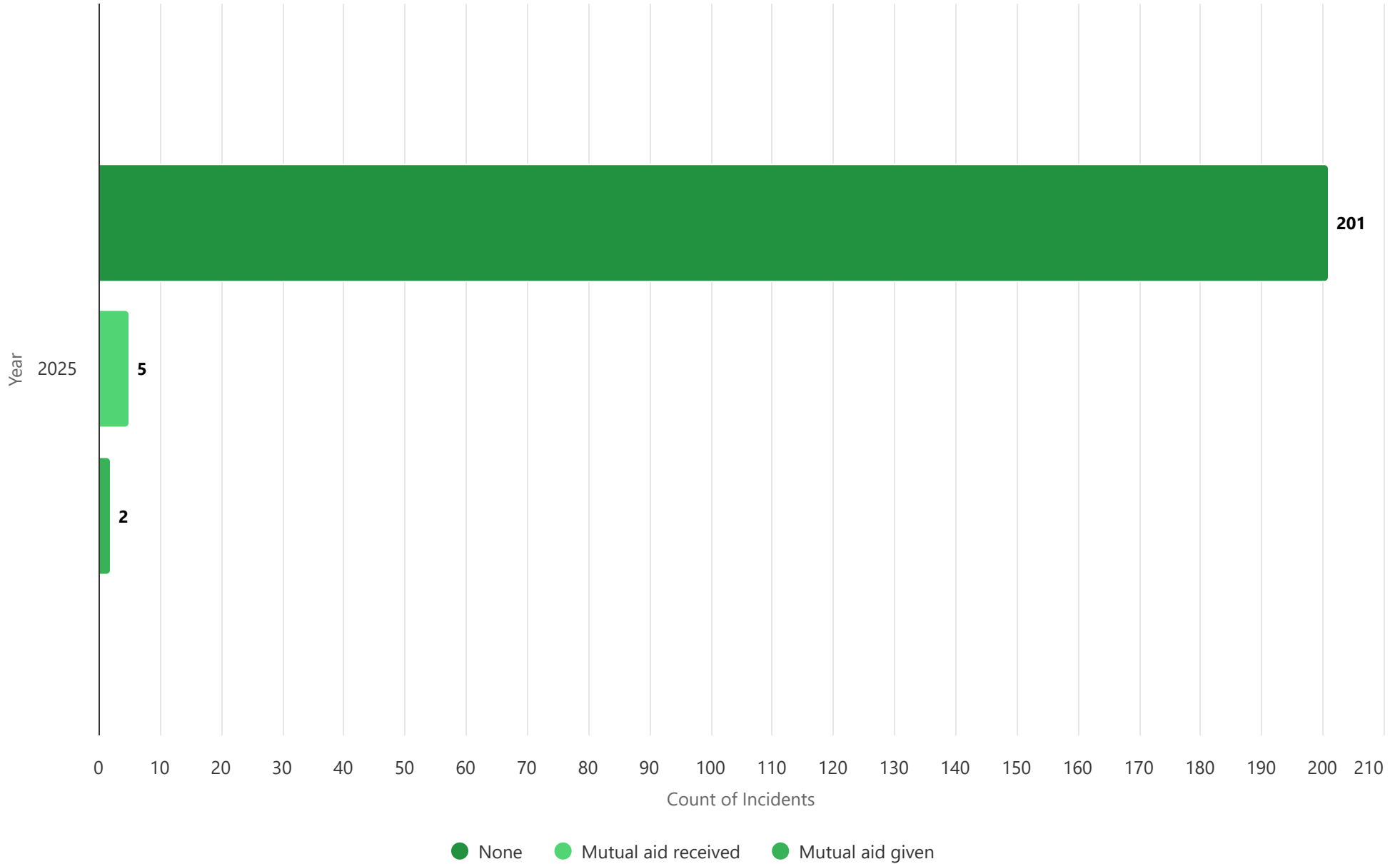

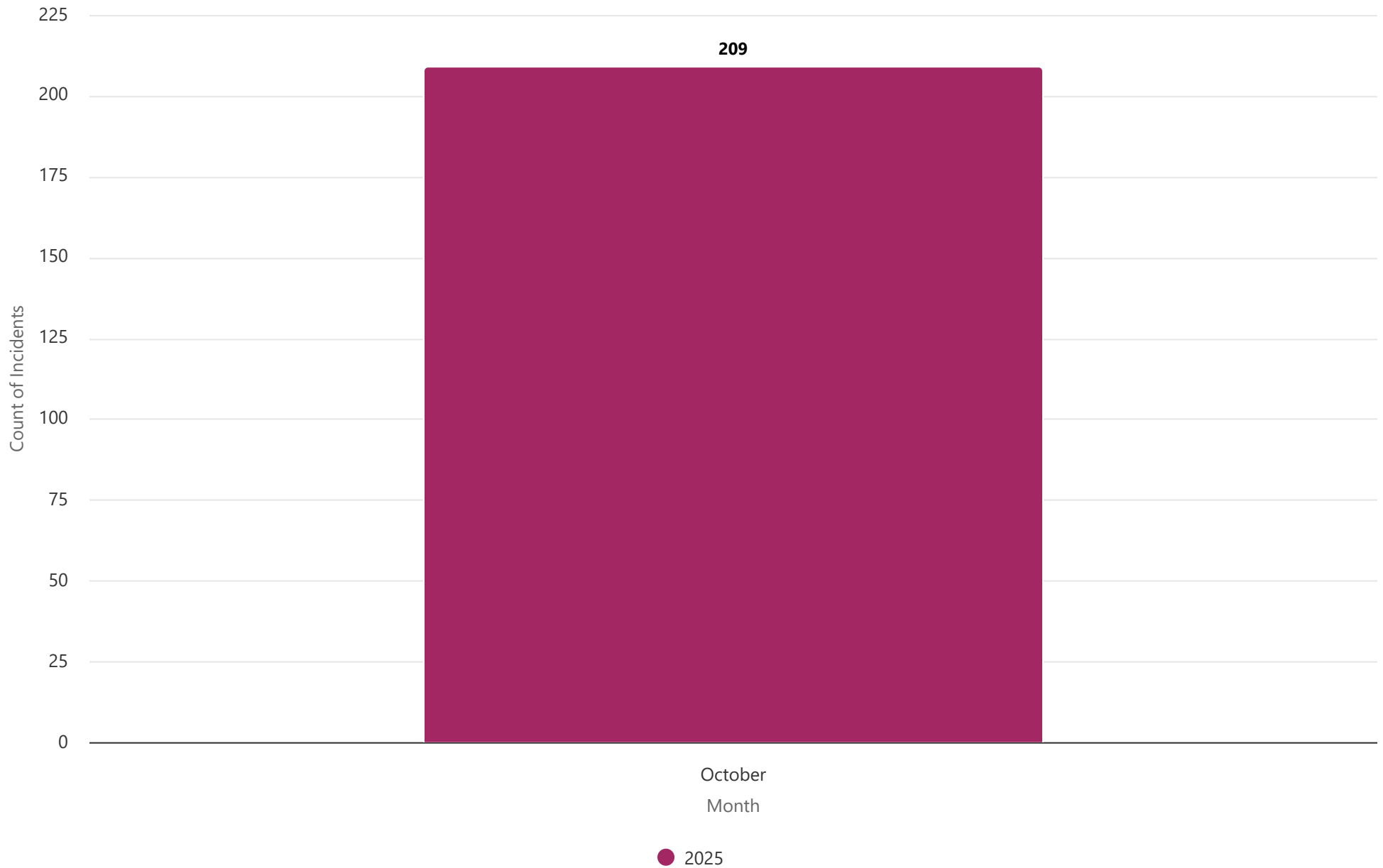

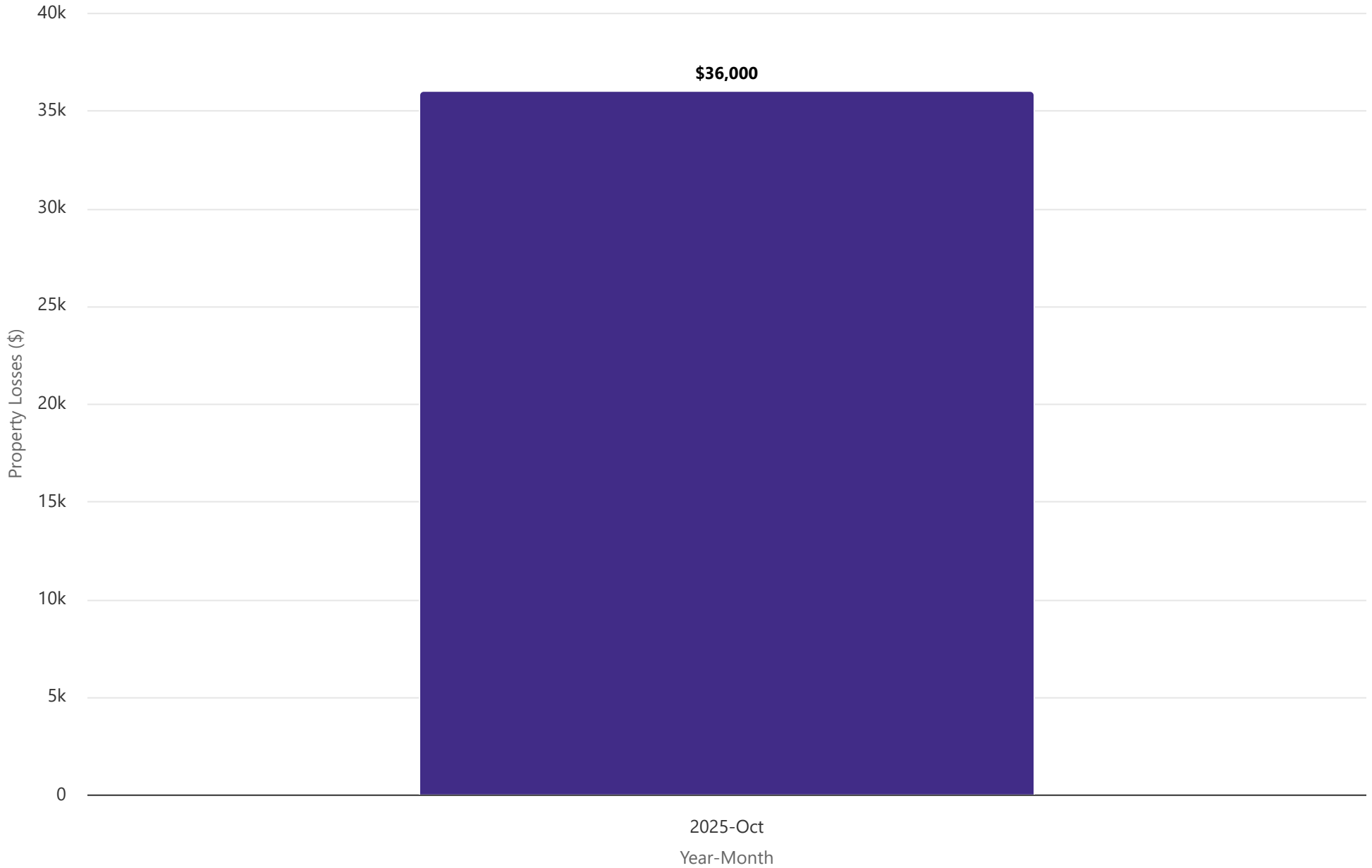


My Fancier's license has been issued allowing up to 5 dogs for many years. In the past few years, I've actually had fewer dogs than that.



The Village recently received an Act 102 funding award from the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Division of Public Health, Office of Preparedness and Emergency Health Care, EMS Section. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Division of Public Health, Office of Preparedness and Emergency Health Care, EMS Section is pleased to notify you of your Emergency Medical Services Funding Assistance Program award based on your service’s application for state fiscal year 2025 (July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025). Please retain this letter for your records as it contains the breakdown of your award. Payments will be going out via automated clearing house (ACH) payment transferred electronically to the designated account. If you receive this letter and do not see an ACH payment, please check with your municipality as the payment may have been sent directly to the designated municipal payee before being forwarded to your service.

According to Wis. Stat. §§ 256.12(4) and (5), funding is based on two separate calculations.

The first amount fulfills Wis. Stat. § 256.12(4) and includes the base amount of **\$10,000** plus **\$2.98** per capita. An additional **\$10.50** was equally distributed to services reporting population to expend remaining funds that could not be further divided per capita. Your emergency medical responder department or ambulance service may use support and improvement funds for the purchase of ambulance service vehicles or vehicle equipment, emergency medical service supplies or equipment, nondurable or disposable medical supplies or equipment, medications, or emergency medical training for personnel. With the recent statutory change allowing **up to 15%** of this award to purchase nondurable or disposable medical supplies or equipment and medications, a separate line listing 15% percent of your support and improvement award is provided for your reference. Per Wis. Stat. § 256.12(4), support and improvement funds shall supplement existing, budgeted moneys of, or provided to, an ambulance service and may not be used to replace, decrease, or release for alternative purposes the existing, budgeted moneys of, or provided to, the ambulance service provider.

The second amount fulfills Wis. Stat. § 256.12(5) and is determined by dividing \$1,000,000 equally among all qualified services applying for emergency medical services practitioner and emergency medical responder training and examination aid. This allotment can only be used to purchase the training and/or administration of the examination required for licensure and renewal of licensure as an emergency medical technician or for certification and renewal of certification as an emergency medical responder. Services that did not request or are ineligible (i.e. private-for-profit services) for training and examination funds will not have this amount listed.





SUBMITTED BY: Chief Patrick Merten

SUMMARY EXPLANATION:

The Lateral Transfer Side Agreement approved in 2021 allowed the Chief of Police to grant up to 16 days of vacation to incoming officers with seven or more years of prior law enforcement experience. However, the 2021 agreement did not clearly state whether a lateral transfer officer would begin accruing vacation at the zero-year level or at a level consistent with their actual years of prior service.

The updated Side Letter resolves this ambiguity by explicitly authorizing the Chief of Police to place a lateral transfer candidate appropriately on both the wage scale and the vacation accrual schedule, based on their verified prior law enforcement experience.

Attracting and retaining highly qualified and experienced lateral transfer officers is essential to maintaining an effective and professional police department. Clarifying how wage scale placement and vacation accrual are determined promotes fairness, competitiveness, and supports long-term retention efforts.

Under this updated agreement, an incoming lateral transfer officer with eight years of prior law enforcement experience will begin accruing vacation at the eight-year level rather than starting from zero.

Side Letter of Agreement Between

This Side Letter of Agreement (hereinafter “the Agreement”) is entered into by and between the Village of Germantown (hereinafter “the Village”) and the Germantown Professional Police Association (hereinafter “GPPA”) related to LATERAL TRANSFERS.

WHEREAS, the Village and GPPA are parties to a collective bargaining agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Village and GPPA agree and realize that it is in both parties’ interest to establish a Lateral Transfer Program; and

WHEREAS, the parties agree to modify their collective bargaining agreement, as reflected herein, to provide for a Lateral Transfer Program.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The parties agree to create Section 4.05 in their collective bargaining agreement to read as follows:

“The Lateral Entry Program will provide accelerated salary incentives for qualified candidates. Candidates may be credited with years of service for prior law enforcement years of service. At the discretion of the Chief of Police, experienced candidates may be placed in any step in Appendix A of this agreement.”

2. Further, the parties agree to create Section 10.04 in their collective bargaining agreement to read as follows:

“Candidates who qualify for the Lateral Entry Program may be credited with prior law enforcement years of service for determining vacation allowance and vacation accrual. The Chief of Police may place a candidate anywhere in the current wage scale contained in Appendix A of this agreement and anywhere in the current vacation accrual system of the agreement, based on experience. Vacation can be used by lateral transfers after the successful completion of Field Training.”

3. This Agreement shall be incorporated into the parties’ successor collective bargaining agreement, unless negotiated in a different form in bargaining of that agreement.

This Agreement contains the complete agreement and understanding between the parties in reference to all of the matters herein agreed upon and no representations, promises, agreements or understandings, written or oral, not herein contained shall be of force or effect.

The previous K9 side agreement, established in 2004, was written when the Police Department employed only one K9 and one handler. The department has since expanded its program and now operates three K9s with three handlers. Of these, two are dual-purpose K9s and one is a therapy K9.

The original agreement did not distinguish between dual-purpose and therapy K9s. The updated language now explicitly recognizes both categories—dual-purpose and/or therapy dogs. This revision does not alter any existing benefits for K9 handlers; it simply modernizes the agreement to reflect current classifications within the K9 program.

Side Letter of Agreement Between

As of the date of full and final execution (the "Effective Date"), this side letter of Agreement (hereinafter "the Agreement") is entered into by and between the Village of Germantown (hereinafter "the Village") and the Germantown Professional Police Association (hereinafter "GPPA") related to CANINE HANDLER COMPENSATION.

WHEREAS, the Village and GPPA agree and realize that it is in both parties' interest to establish a CANINE HANDLER COMPENSATION Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The canine handler (dual purpose & therapy) will be allowed to dedicate the last half (.5) hour of his/her shift solely to the daily/routine care, feeding, and grooming of the canine. These tasks can be performed either at the Police Department, or at the canine handler's personal residence. If the handler is diverted to other non-canine specific tasks during this final half (.5) hour of the shift (or any portion thereof), the canine handler shall earn compensatory time or paid overtime for the actual amount of time spent caring for the canine in excess of the handler's regular 8.5 hour shift, not to exceed a half (.5) hour.
2. The canine handler (dual purpose & therapy) will receive one (1) hour compensatory time or paid overtime on his/her regularly scheduled off-days for daily/routine care, feeding, and grooming of the canine. The officer will not be compensated additional compensatory time or paid overtime where the handler takes the entire 8.5 hour shift off using sick, compensatory, holiday, vacation days, or any combination thereof.
3. The Chief of Police or his designee may, at his or her discretion, adjust the handler's work schedule to accommodate the time needed to train the canine, provide veterinary care for the canine, and transport the canine to and from work. Veterinarian visits are not considered daily/routine care. Any time spent in excess of the handler's work schedule shall earn compensatory time or paid overtime. It shall be recognized that the long-term viability of the canine program is enhanced by the judicious expenditure of overtime. The Village intends to comply with the requirements of the Fair Labor Standards Act in compensating the canine handler in connection with the program.
4. The canine handler (dual purpose dog) will be allowed to have a "take-home squad" at his/her residence to facilitate response to off-duty requests for the canine unit. The canine handler (therapy dog) will not have a "take-home squad."
5. This Agreement shall be incorporated into the successor collective bargaining agreement, unless negotiated in a different form in bargaining of that agreement.

This Agreement contains the complete agreement and understanding between the parties in reference to all of the matters herein agreed upon and no representations, promises, agreements or understandings, written or oral, not herein contained shall be of force or effect.

SUBMITTED BY: Patrick Merten, Police Chief

SUMMARY EXPLANATION:

In recent years, Flock cameras have played a vital role in assisting law enforcement with numerous arrests — including suspects involved in attempted homicides, sexual assaults, robberies, burglaries, thefts, wanted criminals, missing children and more. These cameras have proven to be an invaluable tool in combating crime within Germantown, enhancing both investigative capabilities and community safety.

When the Flock camera program was first introduced, it was presented as being fully funded through donations. However, we have now reached a point where these cameras have become a critical necessity for solving crimes and protecting residents from violent offenders.

To maintain this essential public safety resource, I am seeking funding to retain our existing Flock cameras for the next five years. Attached is a proposed five-year contract from Flock Safety at a rate of \$33,500 per year, which will lock in current pricing and ensure reliable funding for continued operation.

The Germantown Police Department will continue to pursue donations and community partnerships to help offset these costs. Funding was approved as part of the 2026 Budget. Donations received for the Flock camera program will be directed to reimburse the Village. In 2025, we successfully secured \$7,500 in donations, and we will continue working with Flock Safety and local businesses to promote ongoing financial support for this important public safety initiative.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION:

Section 9.01 of the Germantown Municipal Code incorporates by reference various state criminal statutes regulating public peace and good order. Numerous state statutes incorporated by reference into section 9.01 have been renamed, renumbered, changed, or repealed since the Village Board previously adopted that section. These changes make it impossible to issue citations for certain conduct where the references no longer match. The proposed ordinance makes the necessary changes to update and correct the references.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 9.01 OF THE GERMANTOWN MUNICIPAL CODE RELATED TO OFFENSES AGAINST STATE LAWS SUBJECT TO FORFEITURE

WHEREAS, the Village Board previously adopted section 9.01 of the Germantown Municipal Code which incorporates by reference various state statutes regulating public peace and good order.

WHEREAS, numerous state statutes incorporated by reference into section 9.01 of the Germantown Municipal Code have been renamed, renumbered, changed, or repealed since the Village Board previously adopted that section.

WHEREAS, the Village Board desires to amend section 9.02 of the Germantown Municipal Code to update the references incorporating various state statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Germantown, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

SECTION I

Section 9.01 of the Germantown Municipal Code is amended to read as follows (NOTE: added text is **bold underlined**; Deleted text is ~~struck through~~):

9.01 – OFFENSES AGAINST STATE LAWS SUBJECT TO FORFEITURE.

Section 101.123, Wis. Stats., as amended through and including 2009 Wisconsin Act 12, and as may be subsequently amended, is hereby adopted by reference and incorporated into section 9.01 of the Germantown Code.

The following Wisconsin Statutes defining offenses against the peace and good order of the State are adopted by reference to define offense against the peace and good order of the Village, provide the penalty imposed for commission of such offenses hereunder shall be limited to a forfeiture imposed under section 25.04 of this Code, except that the penalty for the commission of an offense under adopted §101.123, Wis. Stats., shall be provided in §101.123(8), Wis. Stats. References to particular sections of the Wisconsin Statutes shall adopt and incorporate the section in its entirety, including all subsections.

Resolution to pursue countywide EMS system approved

Recommendation heads to county board

WEST BEND — The Washington County Public Safety Committee approved a resolution Wednesday that will allow the county to pursue the creation of a countywide emergency medical services system that would support municipal agencies.

“This resolution is purely to identify that we are looking at the creation of a countywide system,” said Chief of Public Safety Dave Seager. “Nothing more, nothing less. It’s just launching it from the perspective of the county being the leader in this effort.”



According to the committee report, the county wants to discuss and consider a countywide EMS system to ensure long-term fiscal and operational sustainability for fire and EMS departments within the county. The reasons for doing so include rising operational costs, stagnant reimbursement rates, and declining volunteerism for fire and EMS departments.

“These fiscal pressures have resulted in an unsustainable reliance on local property tax funding to maintain minimum service levels,” said the report. “The increased costs – driven by a variety of reasons such as personnel expenses, training mandates, equipment replacement and increasing call volumes – are outpacing the ability of our Fire/EMS departments to be adequately funded with Wisconsin tax levy caps.”

Currently, fire and EMS departments can only raise funding through referendum, borrowing funds or identifying areas to get funds for fire and EMS services within their own budgets (or cuts to other areas in their budgets).

“Those are not good alternatives,” Seager said. “This is a critical mass situation.”

According to Seager, should a countywide EMS system be established, it would act as a “lever” to assist private fire companies.

“It does nothing more than that,” said Seager. “Everything remains (under) local control.”

According to the report, the system would provide cost sharing with county municipalities to help stabilize funding for all participating agencies.

“This partnership will ensure that all residents of Washington County – regardless of municipality – receive consistent, superior and timely emergency medical response,” the report said.

County Supervisor Doug Neumann said that he initially had some concerns about the resolution, but after talking it through with Seager, he supports the creation of the countywide system.

“The message from me and from us should be this is not a county takeover of EMS, like (Seager) said several times, because that’s the way it’s perceived sometimes by the fire and EMS departments,” said Neumann. “I support this because I understand the struggles at municipal levels to pay (for fire and EMS) with rising costs.”

He added that the countywide system would be a good tool to help with rising costs of fire and EMS services, and that it was a “step in the right direction.”

The five-member committee approved the resolution unanimously, and it will now head to the Washington County Board.

The Washington County Board will next meet at 6 p.m. on Dec. 10 in room 1019 of the Herbert J. Tennes Government Center, 432 E. Washington St., West Bend.
