C. Technology update at Senior Center

1. The ceiling projector in the main room is dead and cannot be fixed, it is obsolete. Cannot be fixed. A new projector would not be able to be used as most of the connections are also obsolete and need complete replacement. Would be more expensive than the new proposed technology to update. This affects Wii Bowling, movies, computer presentations, music at rentals etc.. The system between the two ends of the main room are no longer talking to each other and therefore the system in the dining room does not work at all. Talked about taking the television down in the dining room but the cost would be so expensive. Take down, wire covering, painting: talked with DPW it is not in the way and costs nothing to just leave the television there. (boxes etc .replacements 1,290.00) currently are using a projector on a cart. That system is old and the dvd/vcr is not going to last much longer. Hard to use. (show cart)
2. What we are proposing is a Technology update: please see what was proposed by who did the technology at DPW; Global Sight and Sound. Would like to have this in the 2026 budget to be done.
 - a. The technology updates benefits are: easy to use, everything is in one place, accommodates playing of dvd's, Wii bowling hookup, playing movies of streaming on smart television, renters/we could use for power point presentations, seminars, can hear the speakers from the east end of the room to the dining room clearly, can play regular television so showing of football games etc can be done, the picture is clear and bright and does not require lights to be off in the room to watch. Not movable so every thing is always where it should be. Looks clean. Nothing in the way of people tripping over cords etc. contained neatly in the space. Exercise instructors can use videos for their classes to teach new methods.

Discussion Was held: the technology presented was for the large room only. Jan suggested that the technology be updated in the MPR and also the Conference room. Mary will ask the company for another bid which would include those two other rooms

Directors Report

WPRA Conference:

The Exhibition Hall was one of the best part of the conference in my opinion. I stopped by and made acquaintance with several vendors that can help us with plans, design and construction for future projects. It was also nice to visit with contractors who have done work in Germantown.

Mary Fiegel:

It saddens me to report to this commission that Mary Fiegel, Senior Center Coordinator, passed away January 29th after dealing with several physical issues. She was well liked and respected in the Germantown community and her peers at the Senior Center.

She will also be missed by the Special Olympics out of West Bend, whom she worked with for over 30 years.

During the interim of finding a new coordinator Susan Tatalovich, assistant to Mary, has taken on the role of Senior Center Coordinator.

Lease Agreements:

New lease agreements have been drawn up with Warhawks Baseball, Football, and the Soccer club in using the Village Park fields for their leagues. The leases are for two years, And the money the programs pay to use the fields all goes towards paying Total Lawn Care for taking care of the landscaping, and weed control of these fields.

Farmers Market:

Applications have gone out to the vendors who attended Farmers Market last year in hopes that they will renew their agreement to be vendors for the 2026 Farmers Market.

The Vendors also agree to appear on the 4th of July at Fireman Park to be part of the 4th of July festivities.

Community Garden:

Applications went out to all the Community Garden participants in 2025 to renew their lot lease for 2026. Participating vendors have priority to renew their plots each year. They are giving a deadline of March 1st to renew their plots. If they fail to do so, their lot becomes open to public wishing to have a garden in 2026.
