PROJECT UNDERSTANDING



Mission-Critical Operations Cannot Stop

Maintaining operational continuity during renovation and mold remediation is critical to response reliability and community safety.



Cost Certainty through Progressive Preconstruction

The Village has defined a structured preconstruction process. This signals a clear expectation: cost control must happen in real time—not at bid time.



Mold Remediation as an Integrated Scope

Mold remediation is not a side scope—it is a sequencing driver. This work will directly impact schedule flow, crew relocations, and access sequencing.



Transparent Public Procurement

The Village has various requirements that need to be adhered to in this project. Clear documentation, public accountability, and clean bid packaging will be essential.

CG SCHMIDT'S APPROACH

Early Alignment & Risk Mapping

At project kickoff, risks will be identified early, assigned ownership, pricing when appropriate, and tracked through GMP development.

Progressive Cost Leadership

No Surprises. Not only is that one of our core values, but the goal for this project at GMP. To achieve this, we'll use real-time cost tracing, side-by-side estimate reconciliation with SEH, early scope gap identification, and value analysis focused on durability, lifecycle cost, and response reliability to provide fluid estimating.

Operationally Driven Phasing

Our phasing strategy prioritizes apparatus access at all times, clear construction/operations separation, life-safety barrier plans, and mitigation for noise, vibration and dust. Temporary relocations would be mapped out only when unavoidable and would be supported with clear map circulation, emergency paths, and construction zones before work begins.

Mold Remediation Integration

Remediation becomes part of the master schedule, not an isolated event. CG Schmidt will coordinate directly with SEH in this process. Please see the following page for our plan.

Transparent, Competitive Procurement

To protect taxpayer dollars and project integrity, our approach will emphasize thoughtful bid packages to maximize competition, clear scopes to reduce change orders, public bid transparency and documentation, and structured recommendation summaries for Owner and Board review.

Construction Phase Leadership

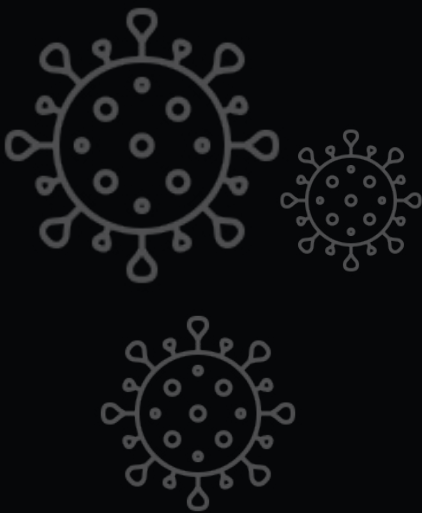
Fully operational. Fully commissioned. Fully supported. That is how we will leave this project. During construction, our focus will include active on-site supervision, strict safety and containment enforcement, proactive communication with station leadership and Village stakeholders, and structured closeout and commissioning coordination.

Mold Remediation Coordination & Implementation Plan

Because a fire station operates 24/7 in support of emergency response, mold remediation must be executed with precision, transparency, and zero impact to readiness.

Our approach integrates environmental investigation, containment planning, remediation, and reconstruction into a single coordinated process that protects occupant health while maintaining uninterrupted operations.

Working in collaboration with SEH, we will translate identified conditions into clear cost, schedule, and phasing strategies—ensuring remediation is addressed safely, efficiently, and fully aligned with GMP development and station response reliability.



1. INVESTIGATION & DEFINITION

- » Identify moisture sources and affected assemblies
- » Define remediation protocol and extent

Project Closeout Precision

Our goal is to complete jobs efficiently and precisely. Expediting project closeout and ensuring all open issues are addressed are important components for successful projects.

We track project closeout activities and milestone dates within the project schedule. Starting the closeout process early eliminates last-minute fixes and inefficiency. For example, as subcontractors are hired, we ask them to provide their Operations and Maintenance (O&M) information along with shop drawing and equipment submittals. This way, O&M information is readily available throughout training an onboarding of staff.

As part of our Quality Assurance program, we utilize a project closeout checklist to keep track of project closeout items.

The checklist tracks:

- » Project closeout notifications (internal and external)
- » Completion status of punch list work items
- » Substantial completion inspections
- » Required project completion certifications
- » Systems commissioning
- » Training of operations and maintenance staff
- » Record-set (as-built) documentation
- » Assembly of operation and maintenance information
- » Project financial closeout record

After you take possession of your facility, we provide:

- » Two-year warranty for all new construction
- » Walk-through and building performance assessments at the end of the first and second years
- » Trouble-shooting and operational assistance on functional building issues for the life of the building
- » Periodic systems retraining, if required, during seasonal changes and the warranty period

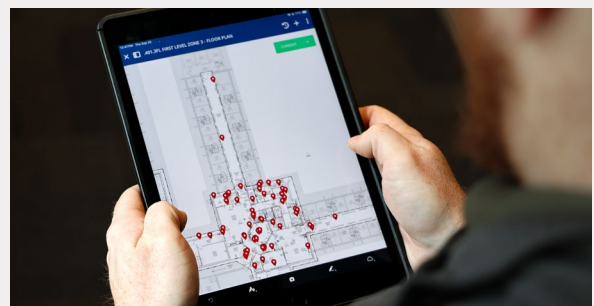

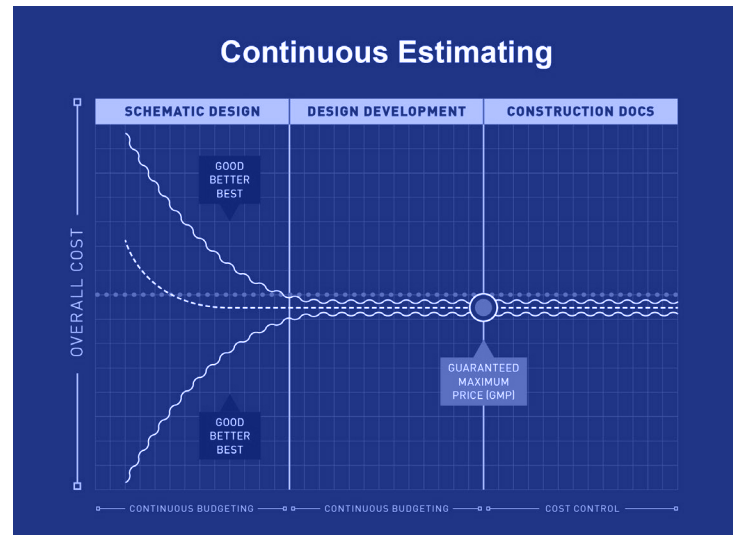

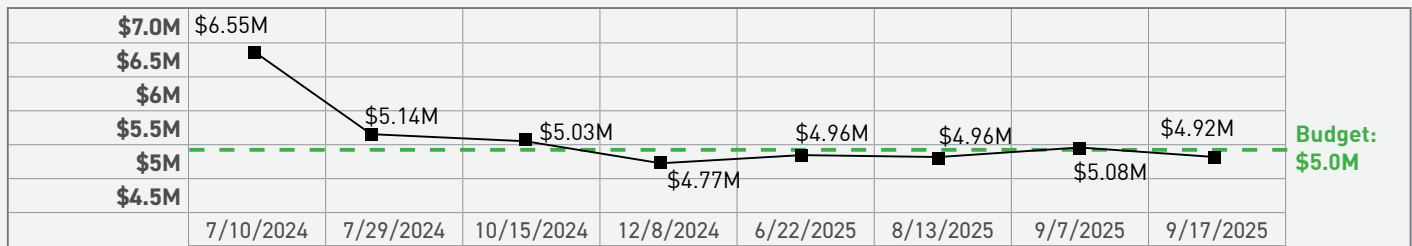

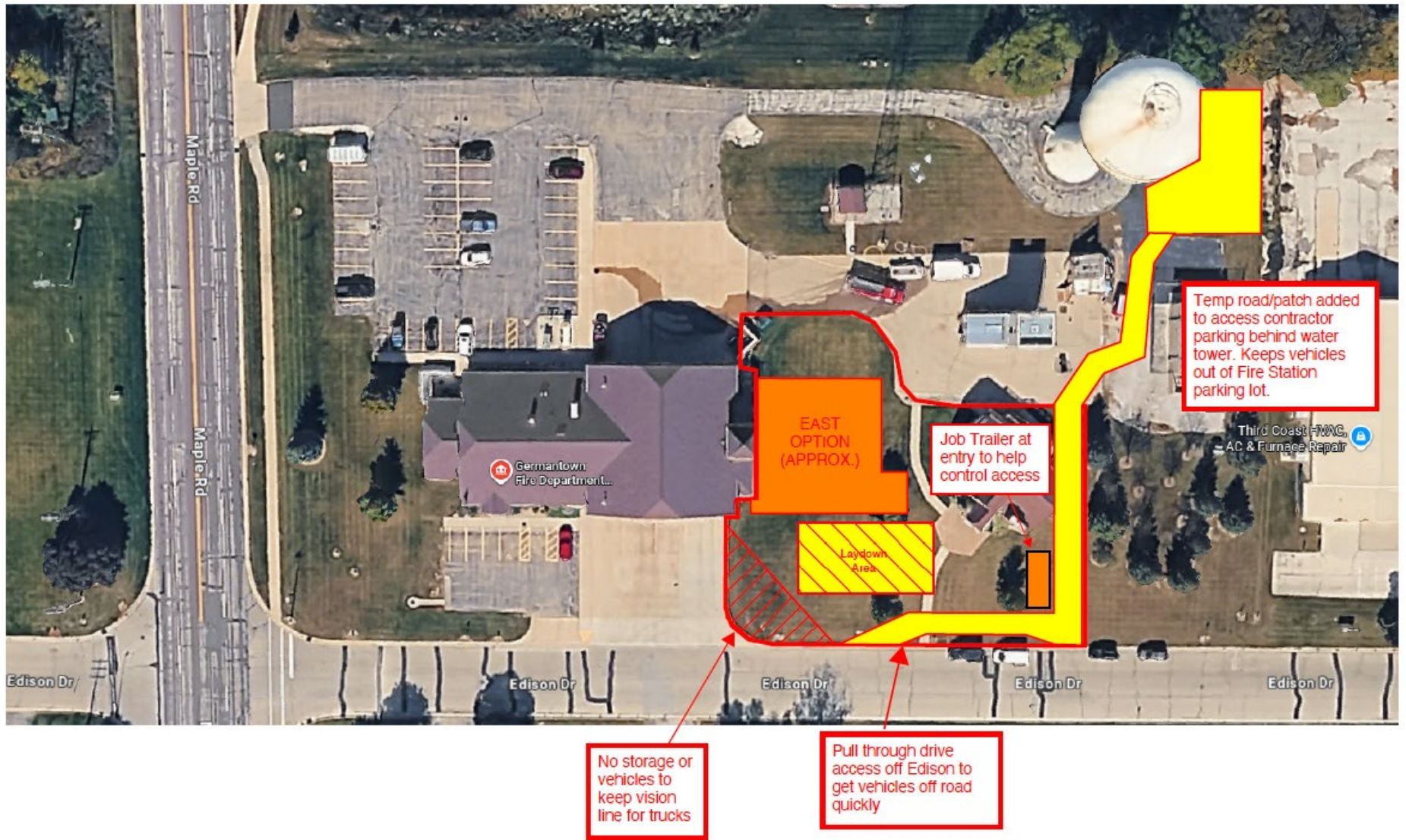

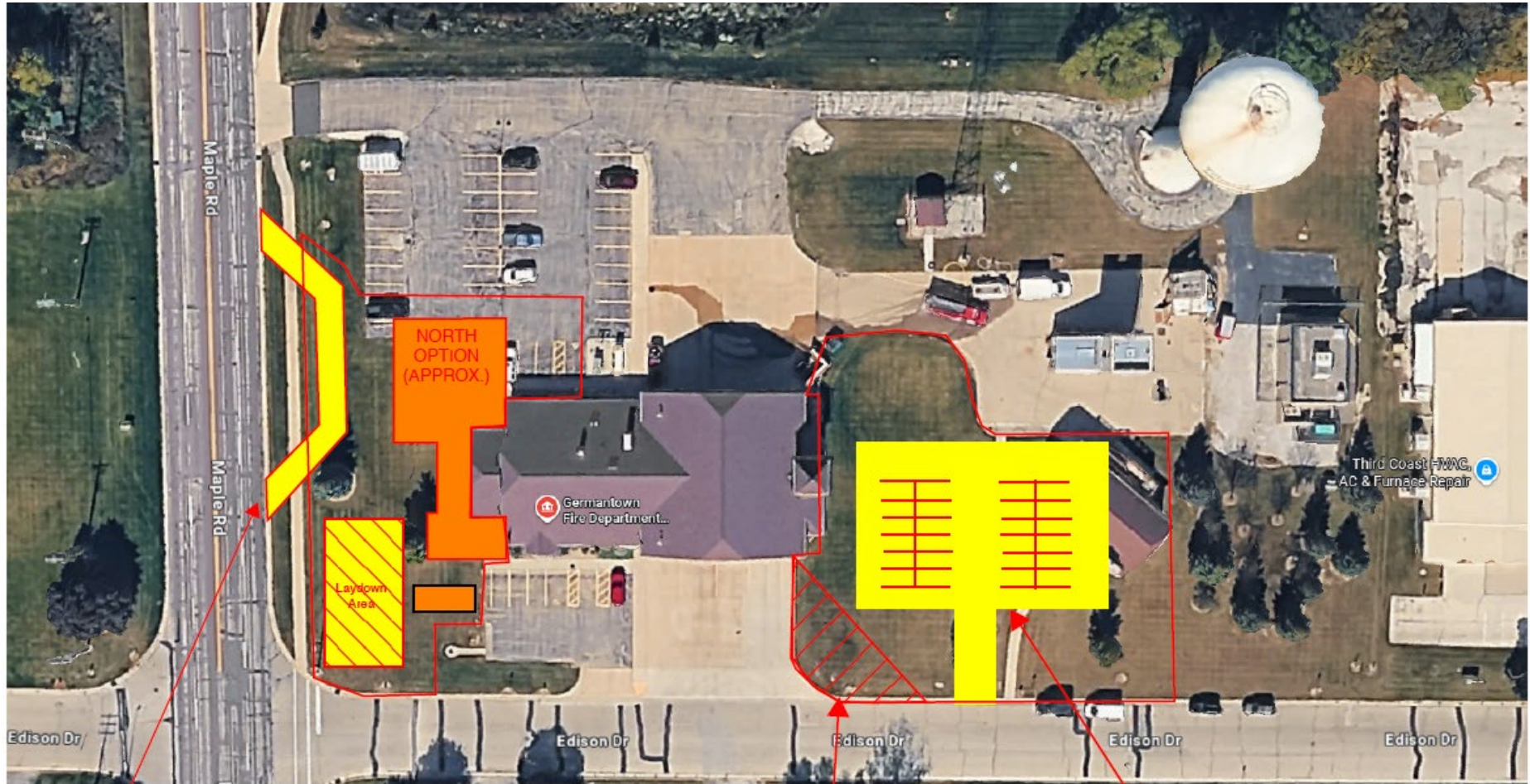

SUMMARY EXPLANATION:

The Village Board approved the hiring of FGM Architects on April 20, 2026, to design the new police department. The next step in the process is to select a Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) through a Request for Proposal (RFP) process.

The RFP will be published on Thursday, May 7, 2026. Interested firms may submit proposals until 3:00 p.m. on May 18, 2026.

The Police Department Building Committee will evaluate all submitted proposals using a 100-point scoring. The top two or three firms will be invited to participate in interviews during the week of May 18, 2026.

Following the interviews, the committee will present its CMAR recommendation to the Public Safety Committee on June 1, 2026.

SECTION 1: PROJECT OVERVIEW AND BACKGROUND

1.1 Project Overview

The Village of Germantown (the “Village”) is soliciting proposals from qualified firms to provide Construction Management at Risk (CMAR) services for the construction of a new, approximately 64,500 to 66,500 square foot Police Department facility. The project includes the complete replacement of existing facilities and a substantial 2,500-foot sanitary sewer and water main extension.

The project will be located at the site of the former DPW building, N122 W17177 Fond du Lac Ave, Germantown, Wisconsin. The Village has concurrently retained FGM Architects as the Architect/Engineering (A/E) team to lead the design. The CMAR will be integrated into the project team at the 30% Design Milestone to provide pre-construction services, cost estimating, and construction phase management.

1.2 Project Scope and Budget

- **Total Construction Budget:** Approximately \$27 - \$30 Million, inclusive of utility extensions.
- **Key Features:** Modern police administration, investigation spaces, evidence storage, indoor secure parking/sallyport, and live fire range.
- **Site Challenges:** Bedrock considerations, stormwater management (BMP), and significant utility extensions.

SECTION 2: SCOPE OF CMAR SERVICES

The CMAR will work collaboratively with the Village and the A/E firm under a guaranteed maximum price (GMP) contract.

2.1 Pre-Construction Phase

The CMAR shall provide comprehensive pre-construction services in coordination with the Owner and FGMA, including:

- **Cost Estimating:** Provide detailed estimates at 30%, 60%, 90%, and 100% design milestones. Reconcile estimates with the A/E team.
- **Constructability Reviews:** Evaluate design documents for clarity, trade coordination, and "buildability," specifically regarding the live-fire range and bedrock excavation.
- **Value Engineering (VE):** Propose cost-saving alternatives that do not compromise the 30-year operational lifecycle of the facility.
- **Scheduling:** Develop a detailed baseline construction schedule including long-lead equipment procurement (e.g., specialized HVAC for the range, electrical gear).

2.2 Bidding and Procurement

The CMAR shall be solely responsible for all bidding and procurement services for construction trade contracts, including bid packaging, advertisement, receipt, public opening, evaluation, and recommendation of awards.

- **Subcontractor Interest:** Conduct outreach to ensure competitive bidding.
- **Bid Packages:** Develop and manage all bid packages in accordance with Wisconsin municipal bidding requirements.
- **GMP Proposal:** Deliver a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) at a point determined by the Village (typically 60% or 90% CD).

2.3 Construction Phase

During construction, the CMAR shall serve as the constructor of record and shall be responsible for:

- **On-Site Management:** Full-time supervision and project management.
- **Safety & Quality Control:** Implement a rigorous safety program and quality inspections, particularly for specialized ballistics and ventilation systems.
- **Reporting:** Monthly progress reports, budget tracking, and schedule updates.

SECTION 3: SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Proposals must include:

- **Technical Proposal:** Firm profile, relevant police project experience, proposed site-specific staffing plan, proposed project team and resume, and project lead and resume.
- **Project Approach:** Specific strategy for the utility extension, live-fire range integration, project approach and understanding.
- **Cost Proposal:**
 - Lump sum fee for Pre-Construction Services.
 - CM Fee percentage for the Construction Phase.
 - General Conditions estimate
 - Bidding and procurement methodology
 - GMP development approach
- **Proof of Insurance and Bond ability:** Ability to provide 100% Performance and Payment Bonds for a \$35M total project cost.
- **A Draft Contract:** AIA A133–2019

SECTION 4: CONTRACT TERMS

The Village anticipates using the AIA A133–2019 (Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Construction Manager as Constructor where the basis of payment is the Cost of the Work Plus a Fee with a Guaranteed Maximum Price), modified for Wisconsin municipal requirements.
